Stewardship Moment.

"Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18.

This scripture reading sums up Stewardship. "Rejoice always" means place your trust in God; He will provide all that you need. "Pray constantly" means prayer should be a running conversation with God throughout the whole day, every day. "Give thanks in all circumstances" means even in bad situations, thank God. Suffering a little bit helps build empathy for others in similar situations and shows our dependence on God.



Reflections on the readings for the 3rd Sunday of Advent - December 13, 2020 Fr. Gary Luiten

Today is called "Gaudete," or "Rejoice" Sunday. It is a time during this season of Preparation, midway through Advent, to celebrate, sort of like a little Christmas. Yes, we even have cause to rejoice in the midst of a pandemic, as I will explain.

Our example of a person who rejoiced during that first Advent was Mary. Think of it this way, nobody looked forward in anticipation to that first Christmas and rejoiced more than Mary. She joyfully anticipated being able to see and hold her child that had been moving within her. And she knew He was not just any child, but there was something special about her baby. He was and is the Son of God, the Savior of the world. Mary really captures the essence of Advent: that season of joyful anticipation and expectation.

And now, you and I are called to follow Mary's lead – to "Rejoice," even when it seems like there is no cause to rejoice, because if we look closely, there is even cause for rejoicing in the bad times. A wise person once said that we have cause to rejoice even if we pay taxes, because it means that we are employed. We have cause to rejoice even if our clothes fit a little too snug, because it means we have enough to eat. We have cause to rejoice when our shadow watches us work, because it means we have been gifted with sunshine. We have cause to rejoice when sidewalks and driveways need shoveling, windows need cleaning, and gutters need fixing, because it means we have a home. We have cause to rejoice when we hear all the complaining about the government, because it means that we have freedom of speech. We have cause to rejoice when we find a parking spot at the far end of the parking lot because it means we are capable of walking and that we have been blessed with transportation. We have cause to rejoice when we must pay huge heating bills, because it means that we are warm. We have cause to rejoice when we have a big pile of dirty laundry because it means we have clothes to wear. We have cause to rejoice when we are weary at the end of the day and have aching muscles because it means that we have been capable of working hard. We have cause to rejoice when the alarm goes off in the early morning hours, because it means that we are alive.

Of course, the main reason we have cause to rejoice is that Jesus has come, and we have hope for a better future now, at eternity in perfect happiness, because Jesus took on our human nature! So, as we continue to prepare for the season of Christmas, let us also continue to celebrate with Our Lady, in particular this Gaudete Sunday, as we anticipate the Coming of Jesus again in Glory.


