The Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God is a feast day of the Blessed Virgin Mary under the aspect of her motherhood of Jesus Christ, whom Christians see as the Lord, Son of God. It is celebrated by the Catholic Church on January 1, the Octave (8th) day of Christmastide. The solemnity is a Holy Day of Obligation. The feast is a celebration of Mary being the mother of Jesus. The English title "Mother of God" is a literal translation of the Latin title Mater Dei. which in turn is a rendering of the Greek title Θεοτόκος (*Theotokos*), meaning "Bearer of God" dogmatically adopted by the First Council of Ephesus as an assertion of the divinity of Christ.

For ceremonial occasions, the bishop wears a miter, a fall hat with two bands of material that sometimes hang from the back. A bishop is given the care of a diocese, a certain geographic area of the Church. One of a bishop's many duties is to be the "ordinary" minister of Confirmation. This means that it is a bishop who usually celebrates the sacrament of Confirmation. He can delegate his role to another priest, especially the pastor of the parish in which confirmation is being celebrated.

#### Reflections on the Solemnity of the Holy Family - December 27, 2020 - Fr. Gary Luiten

Just a couple days ago, we celebrated Christ's birthday. If it was that first Christmas, Joseph and Mary would now have a family. So today it is fitting to celebrate the feast of the Holy Family: Mary, Joseph, and the child Jesus. And this is a fitting day to think about families and family life.

The Holy Family presents themselves as a model for today's family: to imitate their holiness, their closeness to God. Notice, the first thing in the gospel that Joseph and Mary did after Jesus was born was to present him in the temple. Their minds and hearts were focused on what really matters in life: their relationship with the Lord.

Of course, today, we do not have presentations in the temple, but we do have baptisms those first few weeks after birth, which get the children off to a good start in life and in their relationship with God.

An interesting thing happens at Jesus' presentation: Simeon realized how great Jesus was. And, as any proud parents would, Joseph and Mary were "taking it all in." But then Simeon prophesied something to Mary that wasn't so nice – something I am sure that they didn't want to hear: "You shall be pierced with a sword." It was a foreshadowing of Jesus' death. This "scene" shows, in a nutshell, that in a family, there are good times, and there are rough times.

I am sure that many families at this time of the year are usually happy and in a generous spirit. For the Holy Family it was Jesus' birth that made them happy. And also, in many families there are the not-so-good times: times when there is a lack of communication which can lead to anger and quarrels. For the Holy Family this lack of communication happened twelve years later when Jesus was lost and found in the temple. Eventually peace prevailed and their division melted into the peace of God's love.

In Paul's letter to the Colossians, he speaks today of love among family members. Paul says that love involves forgiveness. A strong family needs to be a family that forgives each other. How hard that is for family members, and perhaps for all of us! And just think, God does that all the time for us!

It is difficult to forgive because we may feel that if we forgive them, it seems as if we are saying that what they did was all right. But that is not what we are saying when we forgive. What a person means when they forgive is that they did not appreciate the action, but they love the person too much to let this incident get in the way of the relationship. And so, love involves forgiveness. But Paul says that family life is not just rooted in loving one another but rooted in the love of God.

The bottom line is that it is a challenge living as a family! I know, and I don't even live in a household family. It can be the worst experience, or it can be the best experience! With a firm ground in the love of God and the Sacraments, it can be the best of experiences. How important strong, God-centered families are, not only for the individual, but for the church, for society, and for the world as a whole.


