

Reflections on the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord, January 10, 2021 – Fr. Gary Luiten

On this solemnity of the baptism of the Lord, we remember Jesus' baptism. He allowed Himself to be baptized, in order to give us an example. Jesus, through His baptism, calls us all to be baptized. He also told the apostles and their successors to "Go out to all nations and Baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

At our baptism, we (or our parents for us) made promises – baptismal vows. No one likes a person who doesn't keep their promises. When we became members of the Church, we made promises, or our parents spoke on our behalf and made the promises. It is good for us to periodically examine our consciences, to see how we are living out those promises we made at our own baptism.

So, there are many different questions we can ask ourselves regarding our Baptismal vows. First, and foremost, is the question, "Do we believe in God?" At our baptism, the question was asked, "Do you believe in God the Father almighty, creator of Heaven and Earth?" That sounds like a funny question, doesn't it? After all, we are Catholics. Of course, we believe in God." And so, if the answer is yes, then how do we put this belief into practice? That is, do we live our daily lives with a view to there being a God, or don't we? Do we believe in the triune God? Do we really believe, that is, do we trust God? Do we believe God will help us through the trials of life? Who or what do we turn to in times of difficulty – God or things?

Do we believe in the Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic church? Hopefully, we show our belief by accepting the church's teachings and by receiving the Sacraments faithfully. Do we believe in the communion of saints? And if so, how do we show our belief in the communion of saints? One way is to ask the saints to pray for us. Do we believe in the forgiveness of sins?

For those of us who were baptized as infants, baptism is merely the beginning of a deep relationship with God. Notice, too, Jesus was baptized at the beginning of his public ministry – not in the middle, or not at the end. Again, this shows us the importance of beginning our life in Christ with baptism. Jesus wants us to have a good beginning. So, at the beginning of this new year, may this New Year be the best year for us spiritually. And may we have the grace to continue to live out that first encounter we had with Jesus at our baptisms.




Julie Yourczek


