Reflections on the Gospel - the 4th Sunday in Ordinary Time, Jan. 31, 2021 - Fr. Gary Luiten

The gospel today speaks about demons in "possessed people." These demons, in order to "get back" at God, set out to harm God's greatest creature: us! We don't hear much about demons in today's society – almost as if they don't exist. And that's what the evil one wants. He wants us to believe that he doesn't exist, so he can go around doing his dirty work of tempting people to turn away from God.

In fact, some theologians today don't believe in any fallen angels, or in evil spirits. Some theologians today think that all these cases of possession in the scriptures were just mental illnesses which could be cured with a strong personality. As if Jesus wasn't any stronger than a person with a strong personality! But we know that the contrary is true: that there are evil spirits at work in the world today. And we also know that Jesus had more than a strong personality - He was and is God! Jesus miraculously drove out evil spirits in people and healed them from their sins.

It is good to be aware of the presence of evil but not to be preoccupied with it. We must remember that God can and does save us from the presence of evil and does every day. Scripture tells us that the evil one is powerless against Christ. So, it makes a lot of sense that the more we get of Jesus, the better we are in the battle against the evil one. The more frequently we receive the Sacraments of the Eucharist and Reconciliation, the better-equipped we are to deal with the presence of evil in the world and in our lives.

The gospel today tells us Jesus' reaction to evil. Basically, he does two things. First, He exposes the evil. This is what God can do in our lives, too. In fact, God may have used our consciences to bring to consciousness some sin or sins in our own lives with the hearing of today's gospel. And second, He drives out the evil. Now I don't think most or any of us are possessed. But sometimes we are plagued, or tempted by evil spirits, or simply tempted by worldly things or by our fallen human nature. Jesus has come to root out all of that evil.

Finally, note that the response of the people in the gospel today was that they were amazed. May we be amazed at God's never-ending love for us in his deep desire to root out evil in our lives. May we be grateful for that gift of love and continue to spread that to those we meet.

Pope Francis proclaims year dedicated to St. Joseph

Marking the 150th anniversary of St. Joseph being declared patron of the universal church, Pope Francis proclaimed a yearlong celebration dedicated to the foster father of Jesus.

In a December 8 apostolic letter, "Patris Corde" ("With a father's heart"), the pope said Christians can discover in St. Joseph, who often goes unnoticed, "an intercessor, a support and a guide in time of trouble.

In his apostolic letter, Pope Francis states that "St. Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation. As Mary's husband and guardian of the son of God, St. Joseph turned his human vocation to domestic love into a superhuman oblation of himself, his heart and all his abilities, a love placed at the service of the Messiah who was growing in maturity in his home." Pope Francis also added that despite being troubled at first by Mary's pregnancy, St. Joseph was obedient to God's will regardless of the hardship involved.

"In every situation, Joseph declared his own 'fiat', like those of Mary at the Annunciation and Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane," the pope said. "All this makes it clear that St. Joseph was called by God to serve the person and mission of Jesus directly through the exercise of his fatherhood and that , in this way, he cooperated in the fullness of time in the great mystery of salvation and is truly a minister of salvation."

St. Joseph's unconditional acceptance of Mary and his decision to protect her "good name, her dignity and life" also serves as an example for men today, the pope added. "Today, in our world where psychological, verbal, and physical violence toward women is so evident, Joseph appears as the figure of a respectful and sensitive man," the pope writes.

Pope Francis also highlights St. Joseph's "creative courage," not only in finding a stable and making it a "welcoming home for the son of God (who came) into the world," but also in protecting Christ from the threat posed by King Herod. "The Holy Family had to face concrete problems like every other family, like so many of our migrant brothers and sisters who, today, too, risk their lives to escape misfortune and hunger. In this regard, I consider St. Joseph the special patron of all those forced to leave their native lands because of war, hatred, persecution and poverty," the pope goes on to say.


As a carpenter who earned "an honest living to provide for his family," Christ's earthly guardian is also an example for both workers and those seeking employment and the right to a life of dignity for themselves and their families. "In our own day, when employment has once more become a burning social issue, and unemployment at times reaches record levels even in nations that for decades have enjoyed a certain level of prosperity, there is a renewed need to appreciate the importance of dignified work, of which St. Joseph is an exemplary patron," he said

In his apostolic letter, Pope Francis describes St. Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father, a creatively courageous father, a working father, a father in the shadows.






