

Lenten Regulations

 Everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.



 On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.


Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

Faith Formation Lent Project. For Lent, our Faith Formation Students will be saving alms for the poor. Families will have a Lenten bank to put on their dining tables at home. As families sit down to eat together, think of those less fortunate than yourselves and put change in your lent bank. The banks will be collected on Holy Thursday. All the money collected will go to the Blessed Sacrament Poor Fund.

Movie Night Friday March 19, following Stations of the Cross. "Joseph of Nazareth", to celebrate the 'Year of St. Joseph.' Everyone is invited. We will be following social distancing guidelines.

Pack the Pew is Back! Blessed Sacrament's Parish Lenten Project is "Pack the Pew". We will collect non-perishable food items in a pew of the church. Food will be collected through March 21. As the weeks pass the pew will

become full of groceries for our hungry neighbors. We keep 1/3 of the food for our Blessing Box and 2/3 will go to the Emergency Food Pantry.



Stations of the Cross are representations of the path Jesus took on his way to be crucified. Jesus endured suffering, insults, and moments of support. 'Stations' relay the intense sacrifice that Jesus undertook for human salvation. Blessed Sacrament has 14-Station of the Cross plagues on the walls of the church.

- Jesus is condemned.
- Jesus takes up his cross.
- Jesus falls the first time.
- Jesus meets Mary.
- Simon helps carry the cross.
- Veronica consoles Jesus.
- Jesus falls a second time.
- Jesus consoles the women.
- Jesus falls a third time.
- Jesus is stripped of his garments.
- Jesus is nailed to the cross.
- Jesus dies.
- Jesus is taken down from the cross.
- Jesus is placed in a tomb.

Once a week, during Lent, Blessed Sacrament parishioners reflect and pray the Stations of the Cross. Fr. Gary travels from station to station as we contemplate each one. You are welcome to join us each Friday in Lent at 7 p.m. in the church. Social Distancing standards will be followed.


