

Reflections on the readings for the First Sunday of Lent February 21, 2021 – Fr. Gary Luiten

Upon hearing the first reading this weekend, you might be wondering what Noah and the flood has to do with Lent. You might think, "I thought we were supposed to be thinking about the 40 days in the desert – where there is a lack of water, and here we have the image of a flood – an overabundance of water!" Actually, it is good to think of water during Lent, because Lent leads to Easter. And at Easter, there are baptisms and renewal of baptismal promises.

In baptism, one is cleansed through water. Peter in the second reading reminds us of how Jesus uses baptism to save and cleanse us. After the flood, God made a covenant with humanity. He promised never to destroy the earth with a flood again. God has since made a new covenant with us in Jesus, marked with His blood. God promises through the waters not of a flood, but of baptism, to make us His adopted children. He promises to give us eternal life if we are faithful to Jesus. God promises never to give up on his end of the deal, even if we throw in the towel on our end, even if we seriously offend God. He is still there calling us back and ready to welcome us whenever we allow Jesus to bring us to Him.

And this is where the gospel today comes into play. We are called to keep up our end of the covenant. And that involves repentance or conversion. Conversion, here is not that process some of you may have gone through many years ago in becoming Catholic. Rather, we are talking about practicing conversion each day, that is, becoming more and more like Christ. This is essential if we want to be true Catholic Christians. And what does one discover in order to experience spiritual conversion in one's life? One discovers the awesome mercy and forgiveness of God! And Jesus likes to show off his mercy, so to speak, if we allow Him, especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Confession.

We can be told about Jesus' forgiveness often. But it strikes home much more when we experience God's mercy firsthand. The late Pope Saint JP II himself used the word "discovery" when referring to God's mercy. He stated, "Conversion to God always consists in discovering His mercy - that love which is patient and kind." Conversion to God is always the fruit of the "rediscovery" of this "Father, who is rich in mercy."

May we use the grace of the Sacraments and prayer to rediscover God's mercy and on our goal of eternal life. The Sacraments and prayer can keep us from the sidetracks of temptation and help us to center this Lent on what really counts in the end: on Jesus.


