Reflections on the Gospel for the 2nd Sunday of Lent, February 28, 2021 Fr. Gary Luiten

We have kind of an unusual gospel reading today, since we are in Lent: focusing on Jesus, especially on His passion and death, and here we have Jesus as transfigured. He is changed before the eyes of Peter, James, and John, not as a man suffering and in pain, but as God – glorified. And there must be a reason that this transfiguration account was preserved in Scripture. Here, Jesus is giving us a reason to have hope. The transfiguration is meant to help us to keep our eyes fixed on the prize: on Jesus. Yes, He is one like us, but He is also God - our Maker and Savior. God is telling us through his transfiguration: "This is why you're repenting and fasting, so you can see me this way some day, and so you can shine like me."

Here, Jesus is telling us also that there is a time to be silent. Notice, Jesus tells Peter, James, and John not to tell anyone. Don't' tell anyone? How could they keep from telling people about this amazing encounter? It's like finding out you just won the lottery and then they tell you not to tell anyone. This was such an amazing, miraculous event, that it would be hard to keep secret – but Peter, James, and John were obedient to Jesus, and told no one, until after Jesus' resurrection.

Jesus is telling us in a subtle way here that there is a time, too, for us to hold things in – to fast from rituals of great joy, such as the Glorias and the Alleluias – which we refrain from during Lent. There will be a time for rejoicing again, but now is the time to identify with Jesus' passion, and all the events which led up to His death.

Indeed, through our dying and rising with Christ each day – by denying ourselves the things that WE want to do, and instead doing what GOD calls us to do, Jesus' transfiguration continues in us today. Here, Jesus calls us to set aside our agendas, and to pay attention to the needs of others. Experiences of the Lord's transfiguration help us see beyond the here and now to what will be – our eternal share in the risen life of Christ.
