Lent reminds us of Jesus' preparing for his preaching, teaching, and healing ministry, all leading up to his passion, death, and resurrection during that first Holy Week. Lent reminds us of the **love** that Jesus has for the Father and for us, how Jesus unselfishly came to serve and give his life as a ransom for all of us. Love is what Lent is all about.

Ash Wednesday is February 17. To comply with social distancing guidelines, we have added a Mass at 12:10 p.m. to accommodate a larger number of people.

Lenten Regulations

- Everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.
- Everyone 18 or older, and under 59 years of age, is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

We begin Lent by receiving ashes on our foreheads, a reminder that we are dust and to dust we shall one day return. This is not a morbid thought but a bracing dose of reality. We often behave as if our lives will never end. We put off doing things that we know we ought to do, thinking that there will be plenty of time later. But the truth is that one day will be our last, of which Jesus said, "you know neither the day nor the hour" (Mt 25:13).

Lent begins with this line from the second reading at Mass: "Behold, now is a very acceptable time; behold, now is the day of salvation" (2 Cor :2). We are called to live in the now, the present.

Today is the day of salvation because the past is gone, and the future may not come. We only really have the present day, in fact, the present moment. Here is where we accept the salvation Christ won for us. Now is when we accept the loving will of the Father. It is God's will that we know Jesus and be saved from sin and death.

A simple prayer:

Jesus, you revealed in the clearest possible way that God is love and that God wills that I be saved. You died to accomplish this. It is up to me now to accept the salvation you won for me. I do accept it and offer you every moment of this day so that I may be closer to you. May I be ready to meet you when my life on earth ends.

Reflections on the readings for the 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 7, 2021
by Fr. Gary Luiten

If we look at the first reading from Job and the gospel today, there is a common theme in them: that of restlessness. Job had a restlessness and rightly so. At times we may think we have life rough until we see what happened to Job. He lost everything, including his family, health, and possessions! Everything bad that could happen to him did. And there wasn't much he could do about it except pray.

Thinking about the life of Job causes us to be thankful for all the good things that God has given us, and that life could always be worse. Today, there is a restlessness among some people because of the drudgery of the long winter days. But there's hope - we have a visual reminder of the days getting longer, and there is more sun! There may be a restlessness in our lives because of sickness or the pandemic. There may also be restlessness in people's lives because of a lack of commitment to Jesus and to living the Christian life. Unfortunately, some people, instead of living the Christian life, turn to abusing drugs and alcohol, and become slaves to other addictions. In trying to find freedom, they find slavery.

There may also be a restlessness at home because of problems that occur in relationships – relationships with others and with God. And so, rather than wallowing in restlessness, God wants us to turn to Him in those restless times. Just as the promise of Spring gives us hope in the doldrums of winter, so too does our faith in God give us hope and calm to our restlessness. And where do we find God? Notice, in today's Gospel, Jesus found the Father in the desert and the quiet. May Jesus through Word and Sacrament give us the continued grace we need to turn to Him for peace and refreshment in these long winter months.

And since this is the first bulletin of the month, I have a few other items for you, too.

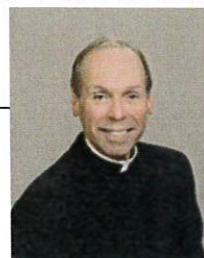
