Community / Diocesan Events

West Fargo – North Shevenne Street Reconstruction Project This project will totally reconstruct Sheyenne Street from Main Avenue to Seventh Avenue. The city of West Fargo expects to see the construction kickoff March 22, depending on weather.

Phase 1: Sheyenne St from Fourth Ave to north of Seventh Avenue including portions of Fourth, Fifth and Sixth Avenues W. This phase is expected to last through most of June.

Phase 2: Shevenne St from Fourth Avenue to Second Avenue including portions of Second and Third Avenues W. This phase is expected to last through the end of August.

Phase 3: Sheyenne St from Second Avenue to Main Avenue including a small portion of First avenue W. This phase is expected to last into early November.

Reflections on the Fifth Sunday of Lent, March 21, 2021 - Fr. Gary Luiten

In the next couple of weeks, we are going to commemorate something very special, and it is all about the new covenant that Jesus gave us. The scriptures tell us about the old covenant - how, thousands of years ago, God decided to make a treaty with the Jewish people: called a covenant. God made the old covenant first with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and then renewed with Moses in Egypt.

In Egypt, God promised to save all the first-born Jewish children through the sacrifice of a lamb. On that night of the first Passover, all first-born children in Egypt would die, except for the children of those houses which had the blood of that unblemished lamb sprinkled on their doorposts.

In the chaos which ensued, Pharaoh allowed Moses and his fellow slaves – the Israelites, to leave. Then all the first-born children died except for the Israeli children, and all the Israeli people were set free from slavery. The Jewish people still celebrate this great occasion as the most solemn feast of the year in a feast called Passover. God led the people Israel out of Egypt from the hands of the Pharaoh, leading them into the desert, and eventually into the Holy land. It was here in the desert where Moses received the Ten Commandments from God, another part of the covenant. But Israel broke their part of the covenant. Yet, God still remained faithful to His part of the covenant. He did not disown them!

And we believe it was on one of those typical Passover celebrations during one of those typical Passover meals in which something else happened that was to change the course of history forever. On a typical Passover meal, about two thousand years ago, Jesus was eating the Passover meal with the Twelve. It was here in which God made a new covenant concerning us! It was here that Jesus celebrated the Last Supper, when he gave his disciples His Body and Blood. The New Covenant has connections with the Old Covenant in that Jesus is now that spotless lamb. In the Old Covenant, the blood of the lamb saved the people from the hands of Pharaoh. In the New Covenant, the blood of the lamb, Jesus, saves us from death and promises eternal life to those who are faithful.

We commemorate that great occasion of Our Lord's supper at every Mass we celebrate. The mystery of what happened on that first Holy Thursday during the Last Supper cannot be seen apart from what happened on the following days, Friday, and Saturday night – called the Easter Vigil.

Just as for the Jews, Passover is the most solemn time of the year, for us Christians, the Easter Triduum ("three days"), is the most solemn time of the Church year. So may each one of us truly be open to receiving God's strength – His grace, and His presence in the coming Holy Week of the year 2021– the week after next and, die with Christ to sin so we may rise with Him and have an Easter we will never forget!

Oh St. Toseph, whose protection is so great, so strong, so prompt before the throne of God, I place in you all my interests and desires.


