except for Thanksgiving, on what day do people eat the most food? Hint: It's the day of the most-watched television show of the year. Yes, it is Super Bowl Sunday. Reflections on the Gospel for the 3rd Sunday of Lent - March 7, 2021 - Fr. Gary Luiten

There are two main points we can learn from Jesus in today's gospel. One of them is by pondering Jesus' anger. When we think of the word "Anger," we tend to think of the sin of anger, which is one of the seven capital sins. And this is never justifiable.

And yet, we also know that Jesus is God, and therefore it is against his very nature to sin. So how could Jesus have been angry in today's gospel? The answer is there is really a different type of anger which is not a sin: a term we call "righteous anger." Jesus had every right to be upset with the moneychangers in the temple. Jesus is telling us, through this encounter at the temple, that there are times when one may be righteously angry.

There are injustices going on all over the world, and people have a right to be angry and upset with others -- when they are being treated unfairly, for example, or when people are not being paid their just wage. We see spousal abuse and child abuse going on every day, and it makes us angry. We hear of human trafficking going on, and that should make us angry! We see around four thousand unborn babies killed each day in America, and it makes a person angry, and rightly so.

When we see the elderly and vulnerable taken advantage of by being swindled out of money, by quick-talking tele-marketers, etc. and that should make us angry! The problem is when we begin to let anger control our lives, when we become angry for no important reason, and refuse to deal with the problem. And that's where the sin comes in. Although Jesus almost seems out of control with that whip, he is actually much in control.

In addition to the lesson of exercising restraint at times and not "pulling out all the stops," so to speak, out of anger, even righteous anger, Jesus is giving us a second lesson, and that is to respect the house of God. Jesus did, and we are called to respect the new temple of the church, by the way we dress and act. We are called to respect the new temple of one another, by the way we treat one another.

And the very fact that our bodies are temples demands a certain respect for one another. If we look back again to the first reading, we see that, although the first three commandments have to do with the love of God, the last seven commandments concern the love of neighbor. One way we can do that is to bring non-perishable food items for our "pack the pew" food drive this Lent.

And so, during this season of Lent, may God give us a deeper love for the Father and for each other, as temples of God and brothers and sisters in Christ.

Since this is the first bulletin of the month, I have a few additional items to mention.

<u>Holy Water Fonts</u>. Bishop Folda is allowing us to use the holy water fonts again, and so last weekend was the first weekend in almost a year that we have holy water in the fonts again. The fonts will be changed and cleaned weekly to reduce the chances of contamination with the virus.

<u>Congregational Singing at Mass</u>. Beginning this weekend, we will sing as a congregation again, since the pandemic has subsided. Breaking Bread song books will be provided so we can follow along.

<u>The Foundation Repair Project</u> continues to go well. All we have left is the flooring. In speaking with the parish pastoral council, we have decided to install porcelain tile in the church worship space and carpet squares in the family room, sacristy, and social hall. The first part of the flooring project will be in the church worship space this summer, and the rest will be done next year. Funds continue to come in from you who have made a three-year pledge. Thank you for your generosity and care for our parish facilities.

<u>Lenten Reconciliation Service</u>. This coming Thursday, March 11, we will have our annual Lenten Reconciliation service at 7 p.m. Five other priests and I will be here to hear confessions. We will follow the social distance guidelines. Hopefully we will have a good number to keep our priests busy!


And this concludes the main topics for this month. May God continue to bless us all with a holy and fruitful Lenten season as we journey toward Easter.
