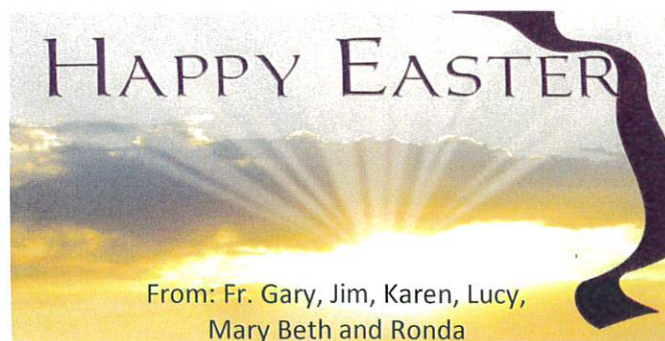

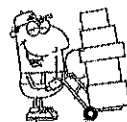

**Sacred Relics of the Saints – Treasures of the Church** The Cathedral of St. Mary presents a teaching and exposition of Sacred Relics on Friday April 30 at 6:30 pm. Fr Carlos Martins of the Companions of the Cross will display an extraordinary Vatican collection of over 150 relics, some as old as 2000 years. ## Reflections on Easter Sunday - April 4, 2021

A happy and blessed Easter to you all! The days of our Lenten fasting are now over, and now it's time to celebrate! The darkness has past, and now the season of light begins! We celebrate with glorious songs, such as the Glory to God and the Alleluia once again. The light came in Easter Vigils throughout the world in the form of a candle -- the Paschal candle -- which represents Christ himself. It is the candle like the one which was lit when we were born again at baptism. And it is the candle which will be lit when we are born again into eternal life. When we welcome the light of Christ into our lives and hearts, then we truly begin to live, not just physically, but also spiritually. We begin to see a meaning and purpose in life!

Living in the light of Christ, with charity, care, and concern for those around us, is not always easy. It sometimes takes work, and it takes faith, especially during these times of the pandemic. We know that being faithful to God, or to anyone, takes a dedicated commitment. And we also know that it may be difficult to keep a commitment for several years. But if we take one year at a time, one day at a time, it is possible! That is why that at this time, every year, we renew our own baptismal vows.

This past week on Tuesday the diocese celebrated the Chrism Mass, when all the priests of the diocese celebrated Mass at the Cathedral with the Bishop, and we all renewed our own priestly commitment and our vows of obedience to Him and to His successors. For the priest, renewing his vows is a good thing. It reminds us of what we are called to do.

And for all of us, renewing our own vows that we (or our parents) made at our baptism, is a good thing. It gives us a focus and purpose in life. We pray that, having renewed our baptismal vows, God would give us an ever-fresh zeal for defending and proclaiming our faith in our risen Lord, now, throughout the Easter season, and for the rest of our lives.

### Jesus' Suffering, Death and Resurrection

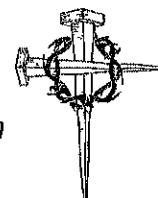
The suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus prove that God loves us. Though humanity had rejected and continues to reject God's love, it has not been abandoned. The Father sent the Son to redeem the world and the Holy Spirit continues this work, opening hearts to accept the salvation Christ won for them.

Saint Paul wrote: "Hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. For Christ, while we were still helpless, yet died at the appointed time for the ungodly. Indeed, only with difficulty does one die for a just person, though perhaps for a good person one might even find courage to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we were still sinners Christ died for us" (Rom 5:1-2, 5-8).

The love of God, the Holy Spirit in our hearts, moves us to share in the ongoing work of salvation. Not everyone knows and has accepted the love of God. Our prayers and interactions with people help them to know and accept Jesus. *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*, "There is not, never has been, and never will be a single human being for whom Christ did not suffer".
