

Year of St. Joseph.

Welcoming the will of God

Joseph is "an accepting Father," because he "accepted Mary unconditionally" – an important gesture even today, says

Pope Francis, "in our world where psychological, verbal and physical violence towards women is so evident.: But the Bridegroom of Mary is also the one who, trusting in the Lord, accepts in his life even the events that he does not



understand, "setting aside his own ideas" and reconciling himself with his own history.

Joseph's spiritual path "is not one that explains but accepts" – which does not mean that he is "resigned." Instead, he is "courageously and firmly proactive: because with "Holy Spirit's gift of fortitude," and full of hope, he is able "to accept life as it is, with all its contradictions, frustrations and disappointments." In practice, through St. Joseph, it is as if God were to repeat to us: "Do not be afraid!" because "faith gives meaning to every event, however happy or sad," and makes us aware that "God can make flowers spring up from stony ground." Joseph "did not look for shortcuts but confronted reality with open eyes and accepted personal responsibility for it." For this reason, "he encourages us to accept and welcome others as they are, without exception, and to show special concern for the weak."


Reflections The Second Sunday of Easter - April 11, 2021 Fr. Gary Luiten

This weekend is not just the second weekend of Easter, but also the weekend of Divine Mercy Sunday. God's mercy is quite obvious in the readings today, that God's love is unlimited and available to everyone — especially the doubters, those discouraged, and even the greatest of sinners. Jesus calls us to use those whom he has appointed as instruments of his mercy to receive his mercy and forgiveness in the sacrament of Reconciliation — especially for our greatest sins, and to ask God's forgiveness in a personal act of sorrow for our small offenses against God.

And on this day, God calls us to practice mercy, too – to forgive others as He has forgiven us – remembering those words that Jesus said on the cross on that first Good Friday: "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do."

This doesn't mean that we are condoning the bad things that people have done to us, but that we just refuse to be held hostage by the slavery of the hardened hearts and the grudges that make us feel horrible. It seems to me that when we find ourselves praying for our persecutors - that God forgive them and give them their spiritual needs - bringing about a deeper conversion of heart in their lives, we have forgiven them. We can also allow God's mercy to flow through us by living out the spiritual and corporal works of mercy - through helping to feed the hungry, give drink to the thirsty, sheltering the homeless, clothing the naked, instructing the ignorant, comforting the sorrowful, and all the other works of mercy. Because what we do to others, we really do to Jesus.

May God's word and sacrament that comes to us today give us the grace to seek God's forgiveness to show forgiveness to others, and to bring God's acts of mercy to those in need.

Decree Reinstating the General Obligation to Attend Mass

In Nomine Domini, Amen.

Whereas, due to the severity of the Covid-19 pandemic, on March 17, 2020 I dispensed the faithful of the Diocese of Fargo from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation; and

Whereas, circumstances now allow us to attend Mass safely;

Therefore, beginning May 1, 2021, the general obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation is reinstated in the Diocese of Fargo.

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill; those who have reason to believe they were recently exposed to Covid-19 or another serious or contagious illness; those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or a nursing facility; those who care for the sick, the infirm, and the homebound; those who are unable to attend Mass through no fault of their own; those with underlying health conditions or in a high-risk category; and those who have significant fear or anxiety of becoming ill by attending Mass.

One should consult their pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend Mass.

With an assurance of prayers for the holiness and good health of all, I extend my apostolic blessing to the faithful of the Diocese of Fargo.


