

That means, beginning May 1, Mass attendance on Sundays or Saturday evenings is a requirement for Catholics. There are a number of exceptions, such as people who are sick, in hospitals or care centers. people who have a contagious illness, those who care for the sick, those with an underlying health condition, those who are unable to attend Mass through no fault of their own, those who have significant fear or anxiety of becoming ill by attending Mass, and finally those who believe they were recently exposed to Covid 19.

Reflections on the Gospel for the 3rd Sunday of Easter - April 18, 2021 Fr. Gary Luiten

Alleluia! Jesus is risen! It seems quite obvious in the gospel today that Jesus wants us to know and believe that He truly is risen, not just in spirit, but in body! He even ate with the disciples in his resurrected form. Ghosts cannot do this, but Jesus did! We are reminded, too, how the disciples on the road to Emmaus came to know Jesus in the breaking of the bread. This points to the Eucharist: Christ's body and blood we receive at Mass. Today's gospel passage took place just after that happened.

Do you ever get the feeling during the pandemic that God is a million miles away, and can't possibly hear our prayers? No doubt, Jesus realized that people would think and feel this at times. So, He gave us the Eucharist so he could be with us always! How often we take this awesome gift for granted, not fully realizing the impact Jesus can have in our lives if we open our hearts when we receive his Body and Blood!

How right and good it is to have that love and respect for Jesus in the Eucharist. Remember the care and love Mary showed Jesus when she perfumed his feet? We are called to have the same love and respect for Jesus — as he is present in the Eucharist, and as He is present in the world. Let us remember that it is the risen Lord we receive in the Eucharist, and it is the risen Lord that is present in each of us in a special way. May we be more aware of our Lord's real presence in the Eucharist and in others, and of His deepest desire to come into our lives more fully this Easter season.
