Reflections from the readings for the 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time June 26-27, 2021 – Fr. Gary Luiten

Life, death, and our health is what the readings are about today – in particular the first reading and the gospel. Regarding death, occasionally, we have tragic deaths in the area. Sometimes when we are in the midst of such evils, one's thought processes become confused. Sometimes we can even begin to think that death is something that comes from God. So where does death come from? We heard in the first reading that death ultimately is a result of the Evil One.

And death didn't just come from the devil, but it came from the envy of the devil. This goes to show us that envy produces nothing good. And yet envy can be such a temptation for many people. We want to be like others. We see their good qualities – their joy, their happiness, their possessions, and one may even resent them because they have those qualities and possessions and we do not. We must keep reminding ourselves, then, that death, envy, jealousy, and all those other evils are not from God.

In contrast to death, our God is not a God of death, but a god of life – **the** God of life! To illustrate this, Wisdom tells us today that "God fashioned all things that they might have being. God formed humanity to be imperishable!" In fact, God's life was given generously in the gospel when we saw how Jesus healed the woman with a hemorrhage and how he also raised Jairus' daughter from the dead.

God desires greatly to give you and me His life in an even fuller way. We are called to turn to Jesus, and not as a last resort (as it seems the woman with the hemorrhage did). One very powerful way He gives us His life is in the sacrament of Reconciliation – humbling ourselves in God's presence and in the presence of the priest by admitting of our mistakes and seeking to become more like Jesus. This allows Jesus to remove those barriers which keep us from becoming one with Him. God's life will make it easier for us to dwell on the positive – to see the good things in others, and to rejoice in them – that God has blest them in so many ways

May we not turn to God out of fear, or as a last resort, but may we keep Him first in our lives, and continue to strive to do what He asks of us, out of love and obedience to Him, so he may live and work in and through us.




