

Reflections on the Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 4, 2021 Fr. Gary Luiten

I hope that all of you are having a relaxing and peaceful Independence Day weekend. You might wonder what's going on in this weekend's gospel. Jesus is coming from somewhere. The Gospel begins by saying that Jesus "departed from there." Where is "there?" It's actually Capernaum, a city on the shores of the sea of Galilee. He went from there to his native town, Nazareth. And, unfortunately, in Nazareth, scripture says that Jesus was "not able to work any miracles there." The reason for that was because the people had no faith in Jesus as God or Messiah or even as a Prophet.

This gospel passage prompts us to think about our own faith lives. Is Jesus doing what we think He is supposed to do in our lives? If not, how is our faith life? How is our prayer life? Obviously, you and I have at least some faith, otherwise you wouldn't be reading this article. But these are questions we should ponder from time to time throughout this day, and perhaps before we go to bed tonight. Do we believe Jesus can and will help us?

If we believe in Jesus, then our prayer lives should show that. How strong is your faith? How strong is mine? Does our personal faith consist in the belief that Jesus is really and truly our God? You might be thinking, "Well, of course I believe that Jesus is God!" But, yet, in practicality, we may end up treating Jesus as if He doesn't even exist, or as if he was just some ordinary figure out of history.

Hopefully, you and I won't make the mistake that the people of Nazareth made in the gospel today. May our faith in Jesus be stronger than theirs. Hopefully, we won't forget in belief and in practice, that Jesus is our God, and may we serve him, as he is present in one another.

Since this is the first bulletin of the month, I have a couple brief items to mention:

- Holy water font. You may notice that in the back of the church we have a container of holy water with a spigot by the stained-glass windows of the saints. It is for you to fill your personal holy water containers and use at home if you wish.

Precious Blood of Jesus

After the month of May, Mary's month, we have a month dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Mary's "yes" to God led to Jesus' conception and birth. The Sacred Heart of Jesus comes to us from Mary. But we might ask, what comes to us through Jesus' heart? The blood that saved the world. Thus, July has traditionally been celebrated as a month dedicated to the precious blood of Jesus.

For the Israelites, the blood of any creature was sacred. Blood is life and belongs to God. And so, in the Law of Moses, the people could not eat any food product that contained blood in it. The first time that human blood was shed – when Cain killed his own brother Abel - the blood of Abel cried out from the earth for justice. The blood of Jesus is different. When it was shed on the cross and fell to the earth, it cried out not for vengeance, but for mercy. Jesus gave his blood, his life, so that we could be free from sin and death and have eternal life.

St. Peter wrote in his first letter: "Conduct yourselves with reverence...realizing that you were ransomed from your futile conduct ...not with perishable things like silver or gold but with the precious blood of Christ". Therefore, I am precious to God!

We pray:

Jesus, I believe that you suffered and died for me so that I might be freed from sin, which leads to eternal death. You rose, and your Sacred Heart beats with love for me always. In the Eucharist you offer yourself – Body and Blood – to me. I offer myself to you.

The daily word I am precious to God.


