This prayer, he says, expresses devotion and trust, and even poses a certain challenge to Saint Joseph," on account of its closing words: "My beloved father, all my trust is in you. Let it not be said that I invoked you in vain, and since you can do everything with Jesus and Mary, show me that your goodness is as great as your power."

At the conclusion of his Letter, he adds another prayer to St Joseph, which he encourages all of us to pray together:

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer,
Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
To you God entrusted his only Son;
in you Mary placed her trust;
with you Christ became man.
Blessed Joseph, to us too,
show yourself a father
and guide us in the path of life.
Obtain for us grace, mercy, and courage,
and defend us from every evil.
Amen.

Stewardship Moment

"He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick – no food, no sack, no money in their belts." ~ Mark 6:8

Imagine taking nothing but a stick when you go on a trip. The Apostles must have really trusted in God's providential care. Think of all the material things "we can't live without" in today's world. We make our life's journey more difficult because of all the material baggage that we drag along. Putting God first in everything and putting our money and possessions second gives us freedom because we don't become "slaves" to wanting to acquire more things.

Reflections on the gospel for the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time - July 11, 2021 Fr. Gary Luiten

Jesus said today: "Take nothing for the journey." For us, sometimes we realize the hard way that it is much easier to go through life without a lot of baggage — and I'm not talking about our physical possessions, but the spiritual baggage that can build up in or lives — including the grudges and problems of the past. For us to be open to the healing power of our God, we must unburden ourselves. It just makes sense. If our focus is on our own wants, if our life is encumbered by all kinds of "stuff", how are we truly to open ourselves to the needs of others?

Looking into the lives of the apostles that Jesus sent out in today's gospel, we don't know much about their backgrounds of most of the twelve apostles - there are different stories that are spread by word of mouth, but we do know some things about a few of the twelve. They possessed at least two good qualities.

First of all, we know that four of the twelve apostles were fishermen. Those were Peter, James, Andrew, and John. I have found out something about being a fisherman. All those who fish must possess a certain quality, (especially if you have the results I have fishing), and I'm sure Peter, James, and John had that quality -- and that is patience. Fisherman must be prepared to go out all day and come back at the end of the day with nothing, or very little at times.

Another quality the twelve apostles had which we, too, are called to develop and practice, is obedience. When the apostles were chosen, they were in the process of doing what they liked to do. The fishermen were fishing. And the Lord said, "Come, follow Me." And yet, they dropped their nets and they followed Jesus. A quality the twelve had here was obedience, and we are called to develop and practice that quality, too. Obedience is one thing we have been taught early on in life, from the time we were little children. Our parents taught us to obey them. And now that many of us are grown, we are still called to obedience – to obey God.

So, realizing God's great love for us, may we be open to God's work of getting rid of the unnecessary baggage in our lives this summer, so we may more faithfully, patiently, and obediently follow in the path of Jesus.
