



Reflections for the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time - July 18, 2021 Fr. Gary Luiten

The readings today use the symbol of sheep. A little explanation of the way sheep live is important, in order to understand the readings. First, sheep are usually most comfortable in flocks. They are social creatures. And second, sheep are not too bright! They get into trouble very easily if not watched and protected well. In Jesus' time, shepherds protected the sheep. The shepherds were not out to hurt the sheep, but their goal was to lead them to nourishing pastures and to cool streams, and to protect them from dangerous animals.

There is a comparison here. We are like the **sheep**; we are God's flock. And we, too, have a shepherd who is Jesus. And it is to our benefit to listen to and follow this shepherd because he is a good shepherd. He wants to lead us to green pastures; that is, he wants to give us peace, the patience, and the strength we need in this life, promising never-ending happiness in the life to come. Jesus gives us, the flock, peace and happiness in the sense that, upon knowing Christ, we then have direction in life and a purpose for living.

Besides Jesus, there are other shepherds who lead people in the spiritual life. The shepherd of the entire flock on earth is our Holy Father, Pope Francis. The shepherd for our diocese is Bishop Folda, and I am the shepherd for this parish. A good spiritual shepherd is one who has other people's well-being at heart, like Christ does, and is willing to be there for the sheep, and to help them in times of trouble. And that's the kind of shepherd I try to be.

So may we remember two things from the gospel today. First, may we imitate Jesus in the sense of having compassion for others like Jesus had when he gave of his time for his followers. Jesus loved them. And Jesus loves being with us! Second, may we remember that we have Jesus the Good Shepherd who is here for us. Do you ever feel as if there is no one to listen to you or no one who cares? We must remember that there is at least one person who cares, and that is Jesus, He is always ready to listen to us when we turn to him. And he is ready to help us, if we simply open our hearts to receive his love, the love of the good shepherd.


