Orientation Evening to the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius Wednesday, September 8, 7 p.m. at the Presentation Prayer Center (Zoom option available). The 19th annotation of the Spiritual Exercises is a way to experience a retreat for the busy person who is unable to take a full 30 days away from usual life. This version of the Spiritual Exercises involves a commitment to pray an hour daily with the exercises and meet with a spiritual director weekly for 30-45 minutes. The retreat is an encounter with Jesus as we walk in our daily lives. We become more aware of how we notice Jesus and the Spirit in our lives through our thoughts and insights, our feelings, and sensations. The daily prayer is centered on Scripture passages and evokes our journey with Jesus.

The genius and beauty of the Exercises is that we learn to weave our own life narrative into the life story of Jesus Christ in such a way that both become more vivid and interconnected. The purpose of the exercises is very practical: to grow in union with God, who frees us to make good decisions about our lives and to "help souls." This evening orientation is designed to provide you with enough information about the Exercises so that you can make an informed decision as to whether you'd like to start.

Reflections for the 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 29, 2021 Fr. Gary Luiten

There is a saying which goes: "Who we are is God's gift to us. What we become is our gift to God." And we grow in holiness through what we do: through "acting on the Word." So, our actions are important. In fact, our actions are VERY important. We are taught that there are good acts, there are morally neutral acts, and there are bad acts. All 3 are spoken of in the gospel.


Bad acts are all those self-centered choices we make in which we refuse God's love. In order to realize the seriousness of bad acts, we must realize that we are in a war. In every war there is an enemy. It the war now being fought on our own land, there is an enemy, which is the devil. The enemy also includes evil tendencies from within the person. That's what Jesus is talking about today when he mentions the list of sins: fornication, theft, murder, adulterous conduct, and envy. Jesus here is not talking about the evil that comes from without, such as falling into a mud hole.

Today, there is a loss of a sense of these sins, perhaps somewhat out of ignorance. Many people don't think these are wrong anymore. But they are. Not only do the sins offend God, but they are damaging to humanity. They keep us from being our authentic selves!

And, lest this homily center on the negative, we must remember there are the good acts also, which we are called to carry out through regarding God's commandment. Notice this word in the gospel today is in the singular — when he says "You disregard God's commandment." But aren't there ten commandments? That's because we can really ultimately boil all ten commandments down to one, which is love. The first three speak about our respect and love for God. When we live our lives so as to radiate the love God gives us, when we live the lives we are called to live, then we do feel good, and rightly so. The last seven speak about our respect and love for others.

And we are called to carry out those acts in at least two ways. The first way is through prayer, which is our relationship with God. We do this communally when we gather together each Sunday or Saturday evening as members of the body of Christ and also at home with the family. We also do this privately in our personal prayer. The second way is through the kindness and love we show to others, such as through praying for them, spending time with them, and being good role models for others in what we do. So, may we be Christians, not in name only, but also in deed and in what we do.
