# Reflections on the Readings for the 26<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time - September 26, 2021 Fr. Gary Luiten

Jesus in the gospel today talks about heaven, or "entering into life." The Eucharist helps us on the way to heaven by giving us the graces we need to live out the faith and to help keep us from sin, which is what was talked about in the first two readings today, and then to practice virtue instead.

In looking at the readings today, I see the opposite of virtue – which is called vice. And one of those vices is jealousy. It is one of the 7 capital sins. In the first reading from Numbers, Eldad and Medad prophesied, but they were not in the same location as the rest. They had been left back at camp. So, a young man came up to Moses: "Stop their prophesying." Moses was upset with that young man because Eldad and Medad were doing the right thing. They were prophesying. Moses then asks them pointblank, "Are you jealous?" In other words, the young man should have rejoiced that Eldad and Medad were doing the good work of prophesying.

The reality is that that young man had gifts, too. Everyone has been given gifts. But the sad fact is that he refused to look at his own gifts, to uncover them, and sought rather to be jealous of another's gifts. Jealousy can be a temptation for us at times. Instead of rejoicing when other people use their gifts and talents that God has given them, we can be tempted to do just the opposite and resent others because we think they may have an advantage over us.

And how does one root out jealousy? One way is through the sacrament of reconciliation. Another way to keep jealousy from having a grip on our lives is to realize that we all have gifts, and those gifts are not equally given to the same degree for everyone. And it is only right and just to thank God for those gifts and to thank God when others use their gifts too. We all have different gifts, and thank goodness. Otherwise, this would be a very boring world.

Practicing the virtues such as humility, faith, hope, love, prudence, justice, fortitude, and temperance, is a way of getting in good spiritual shape. May the life of Christ, poured forth in our hearts at baptism remain with you and me forever, strengthening our spirits in virtue, and carry us to eternal life.


