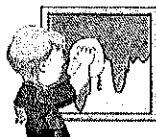

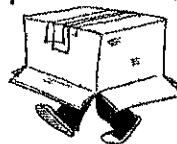

Review

What "mysteries of joy, light, sorrow, and glory" did my day contain?

Reflections on the Readings for the 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time - October 3, 2021
Fr. Gary Luiten

Just a few thoughts on the readings for this weekend. It is fitting that, on this Respect Life Sunday weekend, the readings begin with speaking about the institution of marriage – the context in which God intends for human life to begin and to grow. The readings today have a “communal nature.” They remind us that marriage is good because “it is not good for the man to be alone.” The church further teaches and reminds married couples that they have been called to be clear signs of God’s love for the church. In fact, marriage is the relationship which most reflects God’s own nature of “self-less” love.

The point of the readings today is that God – in using the example of marriage - does intend for people to depend upon one another to some extent – no matter how completely independent we’d like to think we are. We are meant to walk together on the journey – to serve Christ in one another. And on this Respect Life Sunday weekend, it is important to remember that – to see Christ’s presence in one another: in the unborn, in the woman who has an unplanned pregnancy, in a person dying, in the person who has severe pain and wants to end his or her life.

There has been a lot of talk in recent years on assisted suicide. Some people even are praised by some members of the media for choosing so, because of their pain. But when we realize that we are, in a sense one large family – the family of humanity – then we realize that taking one’s life does not end suffering – it only increases it for the rest of the family left behind who miss that person. Also, for the Christian, there is the sense of “redemptive suffering.” St. Paul said, “I fill up in my life what is lacking in the suffering of Christ.” That is, Jesus allows us to join our lives – i.e. joys as well as sufferings, in atonement for our sins and the sins of the whole world.

The person we are called to look to as the example of respecting life is Jesus himself. Jesus tells us in the gospel of John to “love one another as I have loved you.” I really believe that we are in a “love-starved” society. Our society thinks it knows all about love – but not true love, not God’s love. Pope Francis has repeatedly called us to “go out to the peripheries” to care for those “on the outskirts of society.” He talks about the “sacredness of each human person” and explained that “loving life means always taking care of the other, wanting the best for him (or her), cultivating and respecting his or her dignity (as a human person).”

We know that this is not always easy, but in the long run, it IS easier. Just think if everyone lived this way – of loving one another as Jesus loved us – how great a world this would be. We know that the world isn’t going to change overnight. But the world can begin to change, by the grace of God working through you and me, and working through married couples as the living sign of God’s love for us.

Also, since this is the first bulletin of the month, I have a couple other items.

My birthday. Thanks so much for all the warm wishes, cards, gifts, and prayers on my birthday last month. You helped make my “double nickel” day the wonderful day it was.

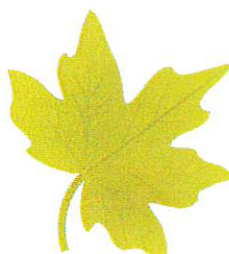
