

Reflections on the Gospel for the 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time - September 12, 2021 Fr. Gary Luiten

The gospel today concerns a core element of our Catholic faith: "Take up Your Cross." St. Mark adds some words of Christ which illustrate what practical form our thanks for Christ's sufferings should take. We must be ready to follow him on the road to Calvary. Jesus says in the gospel today, "Whoever wishes to come after Me MUST deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me."

We must deny ourselves, which involves depriving ourselves not only of sinful pleasure or gain, but even of lawful things at times, in order to be Christ-like. We must take up our cross and follow him. This does not mean that we must search for crosses - there are plenty of them in any good Christian's life. But we must gladly accept the crosses life brings us and see in them God's means of keeping us close to him as an opportunity of "stretching" or "growing" in our faith.

Jesus is talking about abandoning all the attempts we make to try and retain total control of our lives. People who spend their lives thinking only of their own profit or comfort or security are losing their life every moment of their search for these things. But, people who invest their lives for Jesus are winning eternal life - the greatest gift of all. There is only 'One' who can save our lives for eternity. But, He'll only do it on the condition that we completely surrender control of our lives to Him and Him alone. According to the gospel, that's the only way that we can preserve our lives.

There is a name for this surrender. It's called faith. For some of us, it will mean seeing ourselves in a more truthful way. This means that we have to see how our own sins offend Jesus' Sacred Heart. For others, the need might be the exact opposite; to see ourselves as being truly loved and truly beautiful in God's eyes. That is a result of faith lived out, which is what James is speaking about in the second reading today. Our faith is carried out in our good works.

And so, let us ask God for the grace we need not just to believe in Jesus, but to live it out in our lives. May we suffer and die with Jesus, who was crucified under Pontius Pilate, so that we may rise with Him to life everlasting with no more pain, no more suffering, and endless happiness in the life to come.

Year of St Joseph

Place your children under the protection of St. Joseph.

St. Joseph, foster-father of Jesus, similarly knew the anxieties of parenthood. He did not always fully understand his son and the mission for which he came to earth. Joseph simply had to trust that all would be well.

For these reasons, many parents have turned to St. Joseph over the centuries and ask for his special protection over their children. He is known to be a powerful intercessor and can ensure that God will hear the cry of any parent who calls out in faith. Below is one such prayer that will consecrate your children to St. Joseph and entrust them to his loving care.

O glorious St. Joseph, to you God committed the care of His only begotten Son amid the many dangers of this world. We come to you and ask you to take under your special protection the children God has given us. Through holy baptism they became children of God and members of His holy Church. We consecrate them to you today, that through this consecration they may become your foster children. Guard them, guide their steps in life, form their hearts after the hearts of Jesus and Mary. St. Joseph, who felt the tribulation and worry of a parent when the child Jesus was lost, protect our dear children for time and eternity. May you be their father and counsellor. Let them, like Jesus, grow in age as well as in wisdom and grace before God and men. Preserve them from the corruption of this world, and give us the grace one day to be united with them in Heaven forever, Amen.
