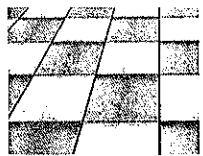

Hidden Work

Ninety percent of Jesus' life is called "hidden." In the gospels we read about his conception, birth, presentation in the Temple, and flight into Egypt, but then, except for an incident when he was twelve and which Luke records, we know nothing about this life until, according to tradition, he was thirty and began his ministry of teaching and healing. He did this for three years and then was crucified, died, was buried, and rose.

We might think that those three years and their culmination in his life-giving death and resurrection were Jesus' "real" work. But the entire life of Jesus, including what is called the "hidden life," played a part in the work of salvation. Why? Because it was lived in obedience to the will of the Father, who wanted Jesus to live that hidden life – to grow up in Nazareth, play, do household chores, and work as a carpenter side-by-side with Joseph.

St. John XXIII once wrote: "Jesus, who came to this world to save humanity, spent most of his life as a working man, in ordinary manual labor. We learn a sublime lesson from this: work is a noble thing, and the better a work is done, the nobler it is. Work done for God in all humility – who could not say that this is not worth doing? Indeed, it is a wonderful thing, and all work becomes supremely great when it is done in the spirit of Our Lord."

What "hidden" work did I do for God?

Reflections on the Gospel for the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time - September 5, 2021
Fr. Gary Luiten

The words that Jesus spoke were good words. They had a real power behind them. His words did a lot of help. The man in the gospel was glad to have the word spoken to him! We hear Jesus' word in the gospel today: "Ephphatha," that is, "be opened." That one word cured the man's deafness and cured his muteness. That one word did a lot! Jesus' word can do a lot for us! It makes it possible for us to hear the word, and to speak the word...! There are actually 2 points to the gospel today: one is the hearing, and the other involves the tongue.

So, the first message involves the hearing. Most of us can hear physically. But at times, we can be deaf spiritually, deaf to the message of the gospel -- to what Christ wants to tell us. We fail to hear with our hearts. Hopefully we come to Mass every Sunday, but do we really hear with our hearts what is being said? The gospel was not only written for the people during Christ's earthly life, but it was also written for all of us in 2021!

God's Word today about love is really about a love for the poor. In the second reading from James, we hear of the importance of love for everyone, including the poor, and not to discriminate against them. Hopefully God will help us to hear the word of God, to love everyone, including the poor of the world, and the poor of our community.

The second point of the gospel today involves speaking. Notice, too, how Jesus healed the man's speech impediment. Jesus made it so the man could again talk! Likewise, for us, Jesus provides us with the grace to speak the truth. The tongue is a great gift God has given us. It can be used either for good or for evil. It is Christ who heals the impediments we have, so that we may speak not out of both sides of our mouth, but that we may speak the truth about ourselves, others, and about God.

Not only were Jesus' words powerful for the deaf man, but they are also powerful for you and me! It was ultimately through Jesus words: "Baptize them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit" that we're able to receive the sacrament of baptism. It was ultimately through Jesus' words: "This is my body; this is my blood" that we now have the great sacrament of the Eucharist. It is through Jesus' words, "I absolve you from your sins" that Jesus forgives our sins. Although Jesus' words were powerful, we must remember that he also spoke of love. May we always remember the love Christ has for us, and may we speak His words, words of love. And so, may the Lord's words "Ephphatha" be spoken to us, to help us to say the things people need to hear, the things that will really help and inspire them.
