## Reflections on the 30<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time - October 24<sup>th</sup>, 2021 Fr. Gary Luiten

If you listen closely to the gospel, there are probably as many different helps that one can get from the gospel as there are people here today. That's the beauty of scripture — it was written for all of us the Body of Christ, and it was written for each one of us as individuals. It would be interesting to ask you to put yourself in the place of one of the people in the gospel story. Who would it be?

Perhaps some of you would say, "I relate best to Bartimaeus. I understand where he is coming from." Though I don't know of anyone in the parish that is completely blind, we all have handicaps. And sometimes we have the desire to cry out like Bartimaeus did, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me!" Another way of saying this would be, "Jesus, Son of David, help me!" This is a beautiful prayer. So, if you see yourself as Bartimaeus, it is sad to realize that one has limitations, but it is good that you realize your need for God.

When you sit back and listen to this narrative in the gospel, you might picture yourself as one of the crowd, telling Bartimaeus to be quiet, and not to come to Jesus. You might agree with the crowd who believe that Jesus doesn't want to be bothered by someone as insignificant as you. If we see ourselves as part of the crowd in the gospel today, on the one hand, this is not a good thing. Although the crowd had some interest in Jesus, they certainly were against the idea of the blind man meeting Jesus. They were against this spiritual meeting.

If you saw yourself as part of the crowd, the one good thing about it is that then we realize that there is room for spiritual improvement in our spiritual lives. Lest we totally "condemn" the crowd, we have to give the crowd some credit. We might say that the crowd "redeemed themselves" when finally, they called the blind man to come to Jesus after Jesus told them to call him.

And finally, there might be people when, after hearing the gospel passage today, see themselves in Jesus' shoes! I can imagine those doctors, nurses, and EMT's who hear this passage can relate to Jesus who healed this man. After all, it is their job to work at restoring health to the sick.

And now back to Bartimaeus. Finally, for the serious Christian, Jesus asks each one of us the same question that He asked the blind man, "what do you want me to do for you?" That is a good question for us to ponder. What do we want Jesus to do for us? Perhaps we can think about that question today and give the Lord an answer.
