



Reflections on the Readings for the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time – Nov. 14, 2021 Fr. Gary Luiten

The first reading today is quite different than the rest of the Old Testament. It was written not too long before the coming of Jesus, and it is different when the prophet Daniel says, "Many of those who sleep in the dust of death shall awake." What does he mean by "sleeping in the dust of death?" The Church takes this verse to mean the resurrection of the dead! Daniel tells us that it will be a very important event. It is really a hopeful reading. The prophet gives us reason to hope when he says, "Some shall live forever: the wise shall shine brightly. At that time, your people will escape, everyone who is found written in the book." So, what is this book that he is talking about?

This is the book in which God has written the names of all the baptized – the faithful - so you can rest assured, our names have been written in that book. God has called us to be with Him forever in heaven. However, we can forfeit that calling because of unrepentant sin. So, this idea of the resurrection of the dead from Daniel fits in well with the gospel today because Jesus is talking about His second coming. He says that when He comes again, there will be a resurrection of the body, which we all hope to be a part of.

We have a lot to gain from these readings. And trusting in God's blessings is one lesson we can learn. Secondly, we must be spiritually prepared for Jesus' coming again. An economic or financial preparedness is not all that important, but spiritual preparedness is what Jesus calls from us. Jesus says, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but by words will not pass away."

A third lesson we can learn is that no one knows when Jesus will come again. Jesus says, "But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." Personally, I'm glad that I do not know when my last day on earth will be. This way, it encourages us to follow Christ and to be vigilant every day, not just the last day of our lives.

Jesus, upon presenting the Good News, never manipulates our free will. He leaves the acceptance of the Good News of salvation to us. May you and I use our free wills rightly and remain close to Jesus so we may be prepared when He comes again.
