

Reflections on the Solemnity of Christ the King - November 21, 2021 Fr. Gary Luiten

In the history of the Israelite people, there have been good kings, and not so good kings. There was a time when the Israelite people did not have a king. And they were crying for an earthly king. The Gentiles had a king, and the Israelites wanted to be like their neighboring nations. The Prophet Samuel told them, "You already have a king, The Lord!" But the people insisted they wanted a king. So God gave them a king they could see and hear. So, Saul was made the first king. And, although kings were important in the Old Testament, every king had his tragic flaw.

But, eventually, after the imperfect kings of the Old Testament, a new king comes on the scene: the first of his kind: A king who is not selfish, not immoral, a king who has no weaknesses: and that is Jesus. And Jesus comes with a new idea: that, as king, He is here to serve! We hear in Mark chapter 10 that Jesus has come to serve, to give his life as a ransom for the many. Jesus came down from his royal throne and took on the throne of the cross. His crown became a crown of thorns. Jesus gave His life for us. That is the ultimate form of service!

The challenge for us Christians is to live according to Christ's kingdom while still living in this world, where keeping the commandments is not in style, where people laugh at the idea of praying and thinking of others first. The challenge is to put the needs of others above our own needs in lives of service.

The calling for us now is to recognize which king we serve: an earthly ruler or Jesus our king. The Kingdom of God will be a long time coming unless we do something about the coming of Christ's kingdom. In a real sense, the coming of Christ's kingdom into today's world relies on us. The coming of Christ's kingdom depends on having the faith, hope, and love which are stronger than the evil powers that are so present in the world today.

May we never forget that the coming of Christ's kingdom relies on our willingness to give our best as members of the Lord's kingdom and brothers and sisters of Jesus our Lord.
