Advent

The first Sunday in Advent marks the beginning of a new Church year.

The Advent Wreath and Candles

The wreath, is made of various evergreens, signifies continuous life. The circle of the wreath, has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, and everlasting life we find in Christ. The wreath is meant to remind us of both the immortality of our souls and God's promise of everlasting life to us through Christ.

The candles Four candles represent the four weeks of Advent, one candle is lit each Sunday, signifying a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. A Fifth candle represents purity.

Week One: The first candle, which is purple, symbolizes hope. It is sometimes called the "Prophecy Candle" in remembrance of the prophets, especially Isaiah, who foretold the birth of Christ. It represents the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming Messiah.

Celebrating Advent is an excellent way to prepare your mind and heart for Christmas.

Reflect ions on the First Sunday of Advent - November 28, 2021 Fr. Gary Luiten

Advent is a special season of the Church year. It is the first season of the church year, symbolizing the freshness of new beginnings. It is too bad society doesn't celebrate this season because Advent is indeed a very important time of the church year. Preparing our hearts is what is important. We are called to ready our hearts for a number of things.

One thing we are called to ready, or to prepare, our hearts for is Christmas. Another thing is to prepare our hearts for when Jesus comes again. When he comes again in his second coming, Jesus tells us in the gospel today that we will come in glory! Everyone will surely know it. Jesus does not want us to be sleeping on the job. He wants us to be awake and vigilant when he comes.

Today's Second Reading from the First Letter to the Thessalonians also gives us sound advice as to how we should prepare ourselves. Whichever comes first, that we depart from this world before the final return of the Lord Jesus or He gloriously returns with His saints on the last day, either way, we should abound in love for one another and for all. Our love should not be limited to our friends, but also for our enemies. Our love should not be limited towards those we are talking to, but also towards those we are not talking to. Our love should not be limited to those we can forgive, but also towards those we have difficulty forgiving. After all, Jesus says in Matthew chapter 7, "For with the judgment you make you will be judged and the measure you give will be the measure you get." That, in a nutshell, is how we are to prepare our hearts.

During the coming weeks, let us make that extra effort to embrace that spiritual attitude so the Season of Advent may become something special for us. May Advent be a true moment of preparation for each and every one of us in the joyful expectation – in the hope of the coming of Jesus at Christmas, at our death and at Our Lord's second and final coming.



Pope Francis Reaches out to ALL Catholic Parishes Throughout the World

Pope Francis has invited the world-wide Catholic Church to question itself on synodality: In order to develop a decisive theme for the life and mission of the Catholic Church. Synodality refers to the <u>involvement and participation of the whole People of God in the life and mission of the Catholic Church</u>.

Blessed Sacrament Pastoral Council Member, Gary Ripplinger, represents Blessed Sacrament on the <u>Diocesan Pastoral Council</u> (council to Bishop Folda). Each Diocesan Council member was asked to bring the following information to their Parish:

This will be a two-year journey (2021-2023) of reflection and sharing. To enable this process the Diocese of Fargo has 14 questions that they are <u>asking all parishioners</u> to reflect on and provide input to either the Parish or the Diocese. The responses will enable Bishop Folda and Pope Francis to develop the future mission of the world-wide Catholic Church.

Gary Ripplinger is reaching out to the Blessed Sacrament parishioners to please give feedback. He will compile your responses and forward them on to the Diocesan Pastoral Council.

- 2 different questions will be highlighted in the bulletin over the next 7 weeks. These questions can be completed after mass or later at home. Please return your response to the Parish Office within the 7-week period. You are free to respond to all questions at any time if you wish.
- There will be an open meeting hosted by Fr. Gary Luiten on Saturday January 15th following Saturday Mass to discuss and capture feedback from the Parish.
