Celebrating Advent is an excellent way to prepare your mind and heart for Christmas.

The Advent Wreath and Candles

The wreath is meant to remind us of both the immortality of our souls and God's promise of everlasting life to us through Christ.

<u>The candles</u> Four candles represent the four weeks of Advent, one candle is lit each Sunday, signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. A Fifth candle represents purity.

Week Three: The third candle is pink and symbolizes joy. It is called the "Shepherd's Candle," and is pink because rose is a liturgical color for joy. The third Sunday of Advent is Gaudete Sunday and

is meant to remind us of the joy that the world experienced at the birth of Jesus, as well as the joy that the faithful have reached the midpoint of Advent.

Reflections on the Readings for December 12, 2021 - 3rd Sunday of Advent Fr. Gary Luiten

The readings can be summed up in one word: rejoice! We hear it over and over again. The prophet Zephania says in the first reading, "Shout for joy, O daughter Zion!" Paul says in the second reading, "rejoice in the Lord always!" Even John the Baptist has a joyful tone in his voice. His words in the gospel were "get ready, prepare for someone better to come!"

One may ask, "Why is there cause to rejoice? Just give me one reason! In fact, there seems to be cause for just the opposite. We hear continuous acts of violence in our nation – from conception throughout all stages of life – and no matter what type of disabilities people may have – violence seems to know no bounds in our society today. Certainly, that is not cause for rejoicing. The Christian response is: Yes, those things indeed are evil. God didn't cause it. He allows it, for a greater good. We just don't always know what the greater good is. Part of the greater good could be the gift of free will – which, of its nature, must include the possibility of doing evil, as well as good. Unfortunately, free will can be misused and abused at times – as it often is in the world today.

But even after having heard of such horrible news, we still have cause to rejoice in our sadness, because Jesus has come to save us! Jesus has come to forgive our sins! Jesus promises an end to the nightmares that can plague our lives.

Joy is something that is not meant to be kept inside a person but shared and spread to others. And this joy can be catchy, which reminds me of one of my favorite stories. I'm not sure if it is a true story, but it certainly could be. It's about a joy-filled girl who smiled at a sorrowful stranger. Her smile made him feel better. This caused him to remember the kindness of a friend in the past, so he wrote him a thank-you letter. The friend who received the thank-you letter was so pleased that he left a large tip at the café after lunch. The waitress, surprised by the size of the tip, bet the whole thing on a hunch. The next day she picked up her winnings and gave part to a poor man on the street. The man on the street was grateful; and went out to eat. On the way home he picked up a shivering puppy and took it home to get warm. That night the house caught on fire, which caused the puppy to bark. He barked 'til he woke the whole household and saved everybody from harm. One of the boys that he rescued grew up to be President. All this because of the joy on a little girl's face that hadn't cost a cent.

Think of the times we were most joyful – perhaps it was when we were children, when we opened presents on Christmas. Perhaps it was when you watched your children open their presents on Christmas. We have even a greater present than any material gift we have received, and it is given to us every time we celebrate the Eucharist – it is Jesus Himself. May we always be reminded of that, may Jesus be our cause to rejoice, even in the not-to-good times, and always.
