

Advent

The Advent Wreath and Candles

The wreath is meant to remind us of both the immortality of our souls and God's promise of everlasting life to us through Christ.

The candles: Four candles represent the four weeks of Advent; one candle is lit each Sunday, signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. A Fifth candle represents purity.

Week Four: On the fourth week of Advent, we light the final purple candle to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait for the birth of our Savior. This final candle, the "Angel's Candle," symbolizes peace. It reminds us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."

Christmas Eve: The white candle is placed in the middle of the wreath and lit on Christmas Eve. This candle is called the "Christ Candle" and represents the life of Christ. The color white is for purity—because Christ is our sinless, pure Savior.

Reflections on the Readings for December 19, 2021 - 4th Sunday of Advent Fr. Gary Luiten

Sometimes I will ask people, especially those who think they know all the answers to our faith: "Why did Jesus come to earth?" And I usually trick them with that question. They answer. "To suffer, die, and rise for us." Hebrews has a different answer, as we heard today in the second reading: "I have come to do your will, O God." So, Jesus has come to do the Father's will. That is why Jesus came to earth.

Just think if Jesus wasn't obedient! Just think if he were selfish and lived his own private life. The sick would not be healed. The deaf and blind would not be cured. And I would not have gotten to meet and know you! From a practical standpoint, we wouldn't have the opportunity to give and receive Christmas gifts! But, most importantly, would not be saved, we would not have hope for eternal life, we would not have hope for peace. We would be living in despair. The world would not know what love really is – love made flesh!

Mary is a person who was also obedient. She did the Father's will. In the gospel today, she had just done so, in conceiving Jesus. Then Mary went to visit Elizabeth. Elizabeth recognized what a special person Mary was and is when she said, "Who am I that the mother of my Lord should come to me?" What deep respect we owe Mary, the first Christian, the one who gave the world its savior.

And, having experienced God's presence through the angel Gabriel, this experience called forth a response. Mary just didn't get on a camel or mosey over on a horse or walk over to see her cousin, she "went in haste" to visit her cousin Elizabeth. She couldn't wait to tell Elizabeth the good news! And when John the Baptist experienced this good news of the coming of the Messiah, he didn't just stir in the womb of Elizabeth, he "leaped for joy!" All of you mothers can just imagine the jolt that Elizabeth felt when that happened. Then Elizabeth didn't just acknowledge Mary's blessedness, she cried out in a loud voice, acclaiming Mary's blessedness!

Like Mary, Elizabeth, and John's encounter with the Lord in Elizabeth's womb, our encounter with Jesus in Word and Sacrament, in one another, in creation, is also meant to call forth a response. We, like Mary, Elizabeth, John the Baptist, and even Jesus, upon encountering the Lord, are called to do the Father's will. And what is God's will for us? Like Mary, Elizabeth, and John the Baptist, it is to obey God by loving the Lord and others.

So, when the Lord comes again, may he find us obediently serving Him, not seeking so much our own ends, but may we see the unselfish acts of loving and serving Him in our lives, as Mary, our Mother, did, and touch the world with the presence of Christ in our lives.
