

Reflections on the Solemnity of the Holy Family - December 26, 2021 Fr. Gary Luiten

On this Solemnity of the holy family, our thoughts are drawn to Mary, Joseph, and Jesus. One may ask, "What was the Holy Family like?" What qualities did they possess? Paul, in giving the qualities that families should practice, is really giving a description of the Holy Family. Among the qualities of a family, he includes love, peace, thankfulness, wisdom, mercy, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. For most of their lives together, they were a simple, normal, unremarkable family, just like any other Jewish family of that time. They did not seek after fame, fortune, or glamour. They prayed to God, like any other typical Jewish family of that time. And then Paul says, "Over all the virtues, put on love!" They loved one another.

And the Lord in the scriptures and by example in his living with Mary and Joseph, is telling families today to strive for the qualities the Holy Family possesses, especially love. The way God has planned it for the continuing of the human race is for a husband and a wife to have children. The fruit of marital love is children.

Love is essential in surviving as a family, and all the above qualities mentioned by Paul. You might be thinking, "My family is the most dysfunctional, problematic family that has ever existed. If you think that, then guess again! The Colossians had these problems, too. Otherwise, Paul wouldn't have said these things.

So, on this special day of the Holy Family, may they be the model for families in our society. When we have a strong family, we have a strong society. When we have strong individual families, we have a strong and healthy church. Let us keep praying for families, and praying for one another, may we all continue to imitate the Holy Family, and strive to be with them one day in Heaven.
