


3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time

"Go, eat rich foods and drink sweet drinks, and allot portions to those who had nothing prepared..."

-Nehemiah 8:10

Ezra's instructions to the people show us that God does not forbid us from enjoying the good things in life. He wants us to be happy! However, God expects us to be grateful for all that He has given us and to generously share our blessings with those who are in need. Now here's the hard part — to share all we have without expecting anything in return.

Reflections on the Readings, the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time - January 23, 2022 Fr. Gary Luiten

Sometimes, (though not here!) people complain if the Mass goes a little long. Imagine the time of Ezra in the Old Testament. It says in the first reading today that – Ezra read from the law from sunrise to midday, and everyone listened attentively! The people had a LOVE for God's Word, a love for the Law God had given them!

Unfortunately, some people don't see God's law in that light today. When they hear God's law of loving your neighbor, or being open to new human life in marriage, they turn the other way. Many times, when people think about church and religion, they think of an extra set of burdens placed upon the person -- just another structure to weigh them down -- to "Keep them from being free!" But it is interesting that the contrary is true. Actually, when we have Jesus in our lives, we are free! And that is one of the emphases of the gospel, that our faith frees us!

Freedom is a wonderful thing. We all want to be free. When we try to live without Christ, then we become not free, but slaves to sin, and eventually bring about our own self-destruction. Jesus says in the gospel that he came to "bring liberty to the captives." Embracing a spiritual approach, it becomes clear that the proclamation of the Lord Jesus was to announce the arrival of the Kingdom of God on earth. It meant that those who were captives of sin, slaves of Satan, would be free, first through the Sacrament of Baptism and then through the Sacrament of Confession so that they could instantly enjoy eternal life after their physical death. It meant that those who were spiritually poor would finally have a living hope in Christ.

And so, the captives are, or were, all of us: the members of Christ's body. You may even notice there are many different types of Christ's Body, the church – some groups that even find it challenging to get along together. We see both ends of the spectrum. We see the non-practicing Catholics, and wee those who are actively involved, and all categories in between.

This week, with a sincere heart, let us reflect upon our commitment to the Body of Christ. "Am I making an effort to draw to my Parish those that I know who have shipwrecked in their faith?" Or "Am I the cause of division within the Body of Christ?" Hopefully God is using us as instruments of unity in the Church. The Lord even gives us a wonderful feeling when we reach out and serve others! Let us continue to pray for Christ to give us the vision to see his presence in other members of the Body of Christ and in the world today.
