Basketball Free-Throw Championship Contest All boys and girls ages 9 to 14 (as of January 1, 2022) are invited to participate in the Knights of Columbus Holy Cross Council #9642 Free Throw Championship. This local level competition will be held Sunday, January 23, 2022, at the Trinity Elementary School gym, located at 2811 7th St East, West Fargo, ND. Practice and registration is from 12:30 p.m. - 1:00 p.m. The competition starts promptly at 1:00 p.m. and typically is completed in about an hour. Basketballs will be furnished but you may bring your own. There is no charge to participate in this event. Boys and girls ages 9 through 11 may shoot 12 feet from the basket or from the 15-foot regulation foul line. Boys and girls ages 12 through 14 must shoot from the regulation foul line 15 feet from the basket. Boys ages 12 through 14 must use a men's regulation-size basketball, all others may use a women's regulation-size basketball. Each contestant will receive 3 warm-up tosses followed by 15 consecutive free throw attempts. Ties are settled with a second round of 5 free throws with no warmup tosses. Normal rules of basketball apply: contestants may not step on or over the line prior to the ball reaching the rim or bouncing off the backboard or out of bounds area. Awards will be given to all first-place winners and certificates of participation and patches will be given to all participants. Winners will advance to the District competition with the chance to move on to the Regional, State, and International levels. All participants are asked to bring a parent or guardian to sign the registration form and verify proof of age. Stewardship Moment

Baptism of Our Lord

"John answered them all, 'I baptize you with water; but he who is mightier than I is coming...he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit..." Luke 3:16

The Catholic Catechism states that "Jesus' immersion in the water is a sign for all human beings of the need to die to themselves to do God's will." In other words, as baptized Catholics there is only one gift that we need to give to Jesus – the gift of ourselves. Surrender yourself to God, place your trust in Him and allow the Holy Spirit to work through you for the greater glory of God.

Reflections on the Gospel for the Solemnity of the Baptism of the Lord - January 9, 2022 Fr. Gary Luiten

Jesus' baptism tells us two main things. The first point is the importance of baptism. How do we know? Because Jesus allowed himself to be baptized by John, even though He didn't need it. Jesus was baptized as an example for us. So, not only did Jesus say that baptism is important, He himself was baptized!

The church, like Jesus, sees Baptism as important, too. In fact, we see that is so important that it should be received within the first few weeks after birth, if possible. And we see this carried out in the early church in the Acts of the Apostles, when whole families were being baptized.

It may be a while since you've seen a baptism, and most of us probably don't remember our own baptisms. So, what actually happens at a baptism? What does baptism do? Baptism takes away sin. Baptism also makes us adopted children of God. And if you ask people who have adopted children why they did so, they will say, "It is because we loved that child." And that is why God the Father adopted us — because of His love for us.

However, it is important for us to realize that in the midst of all this "sugary sweet" love God has for us, God is also just. Isaiah says in 42:3-4, that God will not quench the smoldering wick until He establishes justice on the earth! Here God is not saying, "Because I love you, you can do whatever you want." Instead, we must be just to others.

And so, precisely because of God's love for us, He expects a response from us – a response of love in return – loving Him, (which involves carrying out His commandments) and loving our neighbor. And so, you and I are called to imitate God in the sense of loving one another so we receive the inheritance of heaven someday. And because of having become a member of God's family – a child of God and a brother or sister of Jesus, we have a share in the family inheritance – which is heaven unless we forfeit that through breaking our relationship with God through serious sin. But then we can always get our inheritance back through the Sacrament of Reconciliation!

Secondly, the gospel passage tells us that besides baptism being important for us, even though Jesus is God He is also God's Son. This is part of the mystery of Jesus. The words "father" and "son" are words used in describing a family. Jesus reveals to us today who He really is – the Son of God. It is a family relationship. And so, the relationship between God the Father and God the Son is an example for families today.
