

Lent 2022

Lent

A 40-day period of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Lent reminds us of Jesus' preparing for his preaching, teaching, and healing ministry, all leading up to his passion, death, and resurrection during that first Holy Week. Lent reminds us of the **love** that Jesus has for the Father and for us, how Jesus unselfishly came to serve and give his life as a ransom for all of us. Love is what Lent is all about.

Ash Wednesday is March 2. Mass times are 9:00 a.m. & 7:00 p.m.

Ashes: We don't wear ashes to proclaim our holiness but to acknowledge that we are SINNERS who are in need of **repentance & renewal**

Lenten Regulations

- Everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.
- Everyone 18 or older, and under 59 years of age, is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige.

Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

Pack the Pew! Our Parish Lent Project is "Pack The Pew". We will collect non-perishable food items in a pew of the church. Food will be collected through March 27. We keep 1/3 of the food for our Blessing Box and 2/3 will go to the Emergency Food Pantry.

Stations of the Cross are representations of the path Jesus took on his way to be crucified. Jesus endured suffering, insults, and moments of support. 'Stations' relay the intense sacrifice that Jesus undertook for human salvation. Blessed Sacrament has 14-Station of the Cross plaques on the walls of the church.

- Jesus is condemned.
- Jesus takes up his cross.
- Jesus falls the first time.
- Jesus meets Mary.
- Simon helps carry the cross.
- · Veronica consoles Jesus.
- · Jesus falls a second time.
- Jesus consoles the women.
- Jesus falls a third time.
- Jesus is stripped of his garments.
- Jesus is nailed to the cross.
- Jesus dies.
- Jesus is taken down from the cross.
- Jesus is placed in a tomb.

During Lent we reflect and pray the Stations of the Cross. Fr. Gary travels from station to station as we contemplate each one. Blessed Sacrament hosts Stations of the Cross each Friday in Lent at 7 p.m. in the church. All are welcome to join us.

Reflections on the Readings for the 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time - February 27, 2022 Fr. Gary Luiten

The readings today are about our speech. Sirach says, "When a sieve is shaken, the husks appear; so do a man's faults when he speaks." And in the gospel Jesus says, "Each person speaks from their heart's abundance." What a person says really tells a lot about the person. A person's speech can convey knowledge. It also can convey love. Hopefully the person has both.

Knowledge is a good thing. We spend many years of our lives learning. We spend time learning about the truth. And the truth is a good thing. It is something that people love to know about. Colleges and universities are many times highly regarded as the source of knowledge. But we mustn't forget the ultimate source of our knowledge: Jesus Christ. Remember Jesus says, "I am the way, the TRUTH, and the life."

So, God has given us the scriptures to understand and to come to know. And it is good to know the scriptures and read them because they give us insight into the mind of the one who created us and who redeemed us: Jesus. And it is good to realize that if we truly want to love God, then we need to come to know Him. We come to know him certainly in the scriptures, but also in the holy meal we receive when we gather for the Eucharist. Our young people come to know Jesus through the help of their parents and religion teachers, who teach them about God and teach them to how to pray.

Besides a person's speech conveying knowledge, it can also convey love or kindness, or the opposite: hatred. As Christians, our speech can and should convey love. That is one reason why Jesus attracted so many people: He spoke the truth, but He also spoke from his heart. He spoke with love because He really cared for the people. He was willing to spend His time with them, to heal them, and to die for them.

People will really be attracted to the Love of God shining in our hearts. With the love of God in our hearts, and a knowledge of the Gospel, we can be like the good trees which Jesus speaks about in today's gospel. Those good trees will bear good fruit unlike the decayed trees. Maybe a Lenten resolution for us is to be more loving and kind to one another.

May we become fully ourselves – the way God made us to be - people who speak from our heart's abundance with an abundance of love and truth.
