

Lent reminds us of Jesus' preparing for his preaching, teaching, and healing ministry, all leading up to his passion, death, and resurrection during that first Holy Week. Lent reminds us of the **love** that Jesus has for the Father and for us, how Jesus unselfishly came to serve and give his life as a ransom for all of us. Love is what Lent is all about.

Catholics 14 years of age or older must abstain from eating meat on Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.

### Reflections on the Gospel for the First Sunday of Lent - March 6, 2022 Fr. Gary Luiten

The gospel reading today is about temptation. We all know what it is like to be tempted. Sometimes we are tempted by other people. Sometimes things tempt us. Jesus, in the gospel today, is tempted by the devil. This has implications for us because we are the devil's target. The beginning of this turmoil goes back to the beginning of creation when God created the angels. He created all the angels good. And he even created Satan good. But unfortunately, he turned away from God and refused to serve him.

Notice the three different types of temptation Jesus had: that of power, wealth, and prestige. One might say, "Jesus should have known better. How could he have let himself be tempted like that?" But, if we must be honest with ourselves, we, too, can allow ourselves to be tempted with power, wealth, and prestige.

Wouldn't it be great to have the power to control the world? Then there would be peace! At least that's what we think! The second temptation is wealth. If someone said, "I'll give you a billion dollars if you tell me you renounce the church, how many of us would at least think about it? The third temptation, prestige, is something that most of us would love to have more of. We all appreciate honor, esteem, and praise from our neighbor. And it is good to praise each other from time to time. But when we constantly seek this, then we know there is something wrong.

We, too, at times are tempted, and at times, it may be by the devil. During this season of Lent, we may be tempted to give in to what we gave up, or to stop doing the things we promised to do like pray more, help others more, or to attend Church Lenten devotions. But, with the grace of God, we can stay away from times of temptation, most of the time, and we can say no to evil and yes to God.

Notice the one big thing Satan wanted Jesus to do, was to bow down and worship him. I can tell you what really annoys the evil one. It really annoys Satan to see us worshipping not him, but Jesus, when we bow down and make a genuflection in Christ's presence. But Jesus withstood the temptations to bow down and worship the devil. How? Notice it says at the beginning of the gospel, prior to his temptation: and Jesus was "full of the Holy Spirit." We can resist the power of the Evil One when we, too, ask for and have the presence of the Holy Spirit in our lives. We can resist the power of evil, too, if we have the "spiritual ammunition" - if we have the grace of God given so generously to us in the sacraments such as the Eucharist and Reconciliation.

Let us remember that in all of this, God is more powerful, more awesome, greater than any angel, whether it be a good angel, or a fallen angel, such as Satan.

We pray that more people would say no to the power of evil in their lives and say yes to God.




