#### Reflections on the Readings for the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent - April 3, 2022 Fr. Gary Luiten

The emphasis of the readings today are summed up in the letter of Paul to the Philippians. He states that the gift of faith is important for helping us to attain heaven, and we have all been given it by virtue of our baptisms. And what are the elements of our faith? They are like the four legs of a table and are spelled out for us in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The elements are the Creed, the Sacraments, the Commandments, and Prayer. These four have all been revealed to us through Scripture, tradition, and the teaching body of the church.

These four pillars of our faith are all important for a healthy spiritual life. Merely trying to follow God's law cannot get us to heaven. That is, we can't get to heaven on our own. Rather, it takes the gift of faith, the help from God — the Grace of God. Faith must be put into practice — it is faith and good works which are important in our spiritual lives, which lead us on the road to heaven.

Jesus mentions again and again in the gospels the importance of our good acts or works. These are shown in the love we have for one another -- the works of charity, such as feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, and other types of almsgiving, which is a common thing to do during Lent. Our good acts can also be shown in the spiritual works of mercy, such as praying for one another, through comforting the sorrowful, through counseling the doubtful, and the other spiritual works.

Faith is a good thing for a person to have. Paul tells us what faith does, in the second reading today. He states that faith enables us to do four things. First, faith enables us to know Christ. We cannot truly know Jesus without the gift of faith. Second, faith enables us to share in Jesus' sufferings by being conformed to His death. That sounds kind of strange. But to share in Jesus' sufferings and to be conformed to his death is a good thing, because when we die with Christ, we can rise and live with Christ. Third, faith gives us the ability to forgive. In the gospel today, Jesus forgives the woman caught in adultery. Back in Moses' time, adultery was punishable by death. So, Jesus' letting the adulteress go without a punishment was his way of forgiving her. He didn't condemn her! And fourth, faith gives us the ability not to judge others. May God give us the grace daily to care for and nourish the great gift of faith that He has given us.

#### Since this is the first bulletin article of the month, I have a couple other items to mention.

New Parish Life Coordinator. We now have a new parish life coordinator. It is my privilege to announce to you that our own parishioner, Julie Yourczek, has been hired to be our next parish life coordinator. She is looking forward to beginning working with us and her first day of work will be Monday, May 2. Welcome to the staff, Julie!

Confirmation and First Eucharist. On Saturday, April 2, Bishop Folda will be here to confirm our 3<sup>rd</sup> graders and give them their first Eucharist. There will be 17 of them. Please keep them all in your prayers as they receive these awesome sacraments.

<u>Holy Week.</u> Holy week begins the middle of this month – on Palm Sunday, April 10, when our Lord processed triumphantly into Jerusalem for the last time. On Thursday of that week, we will recall Jesus' Last Supper with His disciples, when He turned the bread and wine into His body and blood and gave them the new command of washing one another's feet. Good Friday reminds us of Jesus' death, while the Easter Vigil, which we will celebrate Saturday evening, reminds us of the resurrection when Jesus won the victory over sin and death. I encourage you to attend these different services, which together comprise the one saving event of Jesus passion, death, and resurrection. And if you are not able to attend the liturgies, I encourage you to pray and reflect on what Jesus did each of those days as we join our lives with his one saving event.
