

Reflection on the readings for the 4th Sunday Easter - May 8, 2022 Fr. Gary Luiten

It is wise for us to see what Jesus reveals Himself as – what Jesus tells us he is like. In the gospel today, Jesus says not only is he LIKE a shepherd, since he has sheep, he IS a shepherd. In fact, He calls himself the Good Shepherd elsewhere in the gospels. What does it mean to be a good shepherd? Well, a bad shepherd might leave one's flock unattended, and forget about his job. But Jesus doesn't do that. He is constantly here for us.

Our supreme shepherd, the shepherd of shepherds, is Jesus. He is the one who leads us to eternal life. All priests are called to imitate Christ, the chief shepherd of the flock. In fact, the word "pastor" is a word which means "shepherd." So, yes, I am your shepherd too. And I hope you pray for me, that I may truly lead you to Christ, to the streams of living water. We priests need prayer, not just the sheep.

It is fitting that we have this gospel passage on this day, because today is the World Day of Prayer for Vocations – vocations to the priesthood, brotherhood, and sisterhood. If you ask just about any priest, brother, or sister why they are such, they will tell you that it is because they heard Jesus' calling. Jesus tells us in the gospel that "my sheep hear my voice; I know them and they follow me." Listening to the shepherd's voice involves prayer – regularly, every day, as individuals and as families.

Part of our duty as Christians is to pray for one another, and to encourage young men and women to a possible calling to a religious vocation. Sometimes they don't see that calling in their hearts, but it needs to be brought to mind by someone else, inviting them to think and to pray about it.

And what are the sheep called to do besides pray? Well, if a person examines sheep in a pasture, they follow the shepherd. They know the shepherd's voice. It is important for us to know the shepherd's voice. It is Jesus whose words were spoken today in the scriptures. They are not just Lukes', or John's, they are essentially God's words to us. How to apply these words to our daily lives takes prayer. It takes a deep, day-to-day relationship with God. May Jesus, who is the good shepherd, help us to do what he did, to go out and spread the good news of salvation to everyone, and to follow Him, the one who leads us to streams of living water.

Since this is also the first full weekend of the month of May, I have a few other items for you.

Mother's Day. This Sunday is Mother's Day. This will be the first Mother's Day without my mother here with me in body, so it will be different. There are many of us whose mothers have gone on before us in faith. Though we trust they are with God in heaven, may we continue to pray for them, that they may enjoy the reward they worked so hard for in this life. And for you who still have your mother with you, I encourage you to not take her for granted, but to thank her and treat her well for raising you and, in many cases, teaching you the truths of the faith. This goes not just for mothers, but for godmothers, foster mothers, stepmothers, and all who have been like mothers to us in our lives.

<u>Firm Foundation Campaign</u>. Thank you to all who have contributed to our campaign the past two years. We are now into the third and final year of our campaign. All the work has pretty much been completed, except for the carpet in the social hall, family room, and sacristy. We plan on having the carpet in by the end of the summer.

<u>Summer Mass Schedule</u>. Please do not forget that the summer Mass schedule will begin on Memorial Day weekend – Sunday May 29. We will only have one Sunday Mass – at 9:30 am, in addition to the usual 5:15 pm Mass on Saturday. This will be the case through Labor Day, September 4. Also, for you going to the lakes for the summer, know that you are in my prayers. It is good to hear that many of you are attending Mass where you will be. I enjoy reading bulletins from your travels. Thank you to all who have brought one back for me. Let us pray for one another, and don't forget to come back in the Fall!




