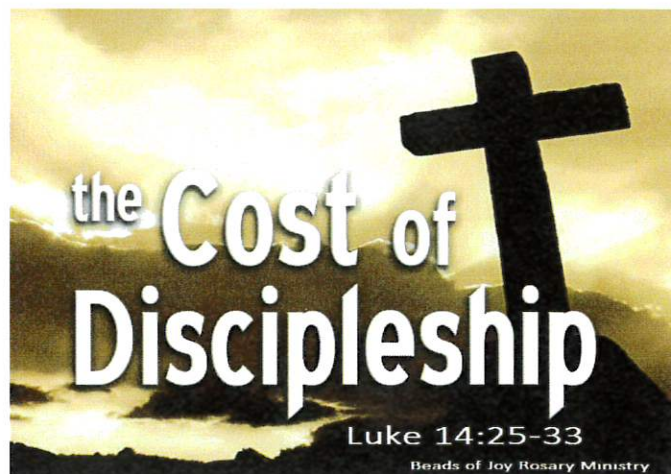

Stewardship Moment

23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Every one of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple."
Luke 14:33

When we first hear this statement, it seems that Jesus is making an unrealistic demand upon us. How can we renounce all of our possessions? We need them to live. However, what we must renounce is the belief that they belong to us. Everything that we have belongs to God alone. All of our resources are entrusted to us not only for our own use, but also so that we can help other. Once we renounce the idea that we possess or are entitled to anything, it is much easier to share the many gifts that God has given us. Then we truly are His Disciples.

23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time - September 4, 2022 (19, 16, 13) DISCIPLESHIP – a deeper look
Fr. Gary Luiten

Jesus talks about calculating the construction of a tower, which points to calculating the cost of discipleship. And the readings remind us today that discipleship involves a choice. Philemon in the second reading had to make that choice. Paul tells Philemon in this letter to no longer treat Onesimus as a slave and instead to look at him as a brother, as a fellow believer, as an equal in the Lord; probably quite a challenge for Philemon who had been his master. That was a moment of truth for Philemon. What would he choose? Philemon must have heeded Paul's letter, because tradition tells us that Philemon eventually became a bishop, and so did Onesimus: Philemon's slave! Onesimus was freed! For Philemon, a part of the cost of discipleship was having to give up the comforts of having a slave.

Every day, or almost every day, life presents us choices – to either do the right thing – to do what the Lord wants us to do in keeping the commandments or not. God's wants us every day to choose God first above everything else – above possessions, above family, above work, above play, above sports, above friends. And every one of us can choose to begin the day in God's grace. By offering the day to the Lord, we choose to begin it with God's help. And that's the way a life is built – from many weeks, many months, and many years of choosing to say "yes" to the Lord each day.

May we ask the Lord each day to give us our daily bread so that we may have the ability to say "yes" to the Lord and to live out our faith lives.

Since this is the first bulletin of the month, I have a few other items to mention.

Eucharistic Conference. As you may have seen in the bulletin, our diocese is having a Eucharistic Conference on Friday and Saturday, September 23 and 24 at the Delta in Fargo. There will be a number of inspirational speakers. Hopefully we can get a good attendance. There are registration forms located in the Gathering Area bookcase.

RCIA Classes. Classes for the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults will be held Tuesday evenings from 7 p.m. to about 8:15 p.m. in the library, beginning September 20. It is for all adults who are interested in knowing more about the church or in becoming Catholic. It is also for those Catholics who want a refresher course on the faith. So, all are welcome. We will meet in the parish library. You may enter through the parish office door.

Blood Drive. Thank you to all who participated in the blood drive this past week. Thank you for giving the gift of life.

Anointing of the Sick. After a 2-year covid absence, we will again offer the anointing of the sick at all Masses on the weekend of September 18. There was a time in the church when many people saw the anointing as something that was given only at the point of death. In fact, some people, sadly, even now equate a visit from the priest as the sign of death. But now the church sees the sacrament of anointing is meant to bring life – God's life, not death. This sacrament is not only for those at the point of death. Therefore, "As soon as any one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time to receive this sacrament has arrived." (Vat. II, on the Liturgy, article 73). Also, some types of mental sicknesses such as some types of depression or anxiety are now classified as serious (article 53). So those who think they would be strengthened by this sacrament may be anointed.
