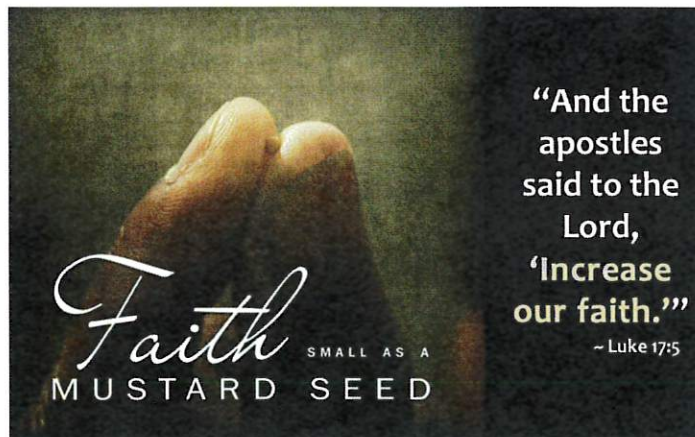

**Reflections on Respect Life Sunday - Sunday, October 2, 2022**  
**Fr. Gary Luiten**

Today is Respect Life Sunday and Catholic Charities Sunday. It's a time when we look at life as a gift. Our lives are arguably the greatest gifts that God has given to us, and they are to be treasured from conception to natural death. The Late Pope Saint John Paul sums up what we are talking about this weekend when he once stated, "In every child (which is born) and in every person who lives or dies, there is the image of God's glory." Unfortunately, though we are grateful for the overthrow of the Roe v. Wade decision, today's culture fails to see that killing of the innocent born and the unborn is an injustice, and that human life needs protection. Saint Mother Theresa once said that "the nations which allow abortion are the poorest nations. The great destroyer of peace today is the crime against the innocent unborn child." Certainly, pro-life laws are a good thing – but more needs to be done – a culture of a love for life needs to be promoted – beginning with you and me.

So how do we respond to all the bad news that society gives us? Jesus says that if you had the faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this tree, "Be lifted up and thrown into the sea, and it would happen." We need to keep that faith alive, to really believe that human life will be protected beginning right here locally, trusting in the grace of God that comes to us from Jesus in the Holy Spirit. This gift of faith given to us can be put into action as we reach out to those in need through our support of Catholic Charities.

You and I are called to pray for a deeper love in our own lives and in the lives of others for the great gift of human life. The US bishops have issued a statement which says, "Catholic families should be living symbols of our conviction that life is always, always a gift from God. Teach your children to respect human life from conception to natural death. Pray as a family for an end to this evil that destroys the weakest of the weak, the poorest of the poor."

We are also called to pray for God's will to be done, and that includes asking God to spare the lives of those who are considered to be taken. May we make that a part of our daily prayer – as we love and respect the gift of human life that God has given. May God help us to reach out in love to those in need as we also support and pray for Catholic charities.

**Since this is the first Sunday of the month, I also have a few other items for you.**

First, my birthday. Thanks so much for all the warm wishes, cards, gifts, and prayers on my birthday last month. You helped make my birthday the wonderful day it was!

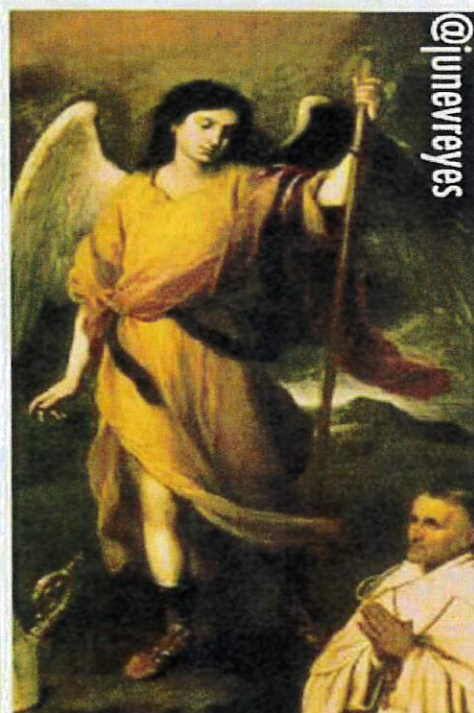
