

Reflections on the Readings for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time - October 16th, 2022 Fr. Gary Luiten

The readings this weekend are about being persistent, or "persevering." St. Paul, in his letters, has compared life to a race. And, with the emphasis in the readings today on persistence, holding out to the end is very important, not only in athletics, but in our faith, too. This raises the question, "Why be persistent?" One may look at others and say, "Look at those who do not persevere in their faith, and look how well they seem to be doing -- living the life of luxury! Well, at least externally things seem to be going well. But we don't always know that is going on in the heart. And, also, remember that Jesus said the last will be first, and the first will be last. In the end, God's justice will prevail.

In the first reading, Joshua because of his perseverance and because of the help of God defeated Amalek, who waged war against Israel. So, receiving Jesus and His Word faithfully and frequently builds the endurance we need to help us to persevere in prayer and in the active Christian life. Then we can live forever with God.

The woman in the gospel persevered too. It is true that this was only a story that Jesus told. But think of what it would have been like had it been a true story. Word probably would have gotten around that this woman kept coming to court, day after day. People would probably have laughed at her thinking that she had no chance of receiving the justice she deserved. But, because of her persistence, she got what she was searching for. And she got the last laugh!

So, the word for us today is, "Keep at it." Maybe you are praying for someone to convert to the faith. Maybe you are praying for someone to come back to the faith. Maybe you are praying that your business can make a go of it. God does answer the prayers of the one who perseveres, sometimes not in the way we want, but in the best way: in the way God wants.

Finally, in the gospel, Jesus makes one last pitch at persevering when he says, "When the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on the earth?" If the answer is <u>yes</u>, perseverance must be a part of our lives, not only as individuals, but also as a church. Hopefully, when Jesus comes back again, he will find on the earth a thriving community of faith celebrating often His saving event in the Eucharist, and receiving the sacraments faithfully and frequently.


