### Reflection on the Gospel for the 30<sup>th</sup> Sunday - in Ordinary Time - October 23, 2022 Fr. Gary Luiten

The focus on the gospel this weekend is on humility. Jesus is saying that in our faith lives, if it is to be a true faith, then we must be a humble people. True humility involves recognizing where we stand in relationship to our God and to recognize our gifts as well as our weaknesses. Humility involves the realization that we are not God nor is any created thing God. We need God's help in order to walk in His ways and get to heaven someday. That is a humbling thing to admit in itself, especially for us independent North Dakotans and western Minnesotans.

Have you ever thought about what God is like? Though God is simple in many ways, the reality of God is a difficult concept to grasp. But even the very thought of God can humble us. I don't know what the beatific vision is like. I have never seen God. But I do know that if and when (God willing) I see God, I will be in awe. God is so great. Compared to God, we are very small yet very important to God.

The opposite of humility is pride. This can come up not only in our relationship with God, but also in our relationship with each other. One such example is the tendency not to want to be corrected, or the tendency not to want to say, "I'm sorry I flew off the handle. It was my fault." That is the challenge we have as Christians – to know our limitations and weaknesses. Humility takes work. It takes a conscious effort.

Notice, too, in the gospel, that the one who got God's attention wasn't the one who expected God's favor. It wasn't the Pharisee. It was the tax collector. Likewise, in the first reading from Sirach, the ones who get God's attention are the weak, the oppressed, the orphans, and the widows. Why? Because at times they have no one to turn to for help except to God. They end up placing their trust in God.

So, may God give us the strength to humble ourselves: to consider the needs of others before ourselves and to place God above all else in our lives.


