

Reflections on the gospel for the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time - October 9, 2022 Fr. Gary Luiten

When we look at the gospel today, we see Jesus at work healing those with leprosy. If you're like me, oftentimes when we hear the gospel story about the ten lepers, we think of only the one leper who got it right - the one who came back and thanked the Lord for being cured. But actually, we can learn from all ten. All ten did something right. They did more than just one thing right. First, they acknowledged their need for Jesus. Second, they obeyed the Lord. Luke says that after having come to Jesus and listened to him, they obeyed him - they went and showed themselves to the priests. We, too. if we want to benefit from the Lord and his graces, must also acknowledge our need for Jesus and obey him.

But one leper did what the other nine failed to do: He came back to give thanks. And because he said "thanks" to Jesus, two things happened: first, he deepened his relationship with Jesus, and second, he received a second gift. The other nine received healing. The tenth received all that, and heaven, too! He received healing and salvation! So, besides physical healing, he received spiritual healing, too!

Jesus is subtly calling you and me to have a faith like this man who came back to give Jesus thanks. If we want to enjoy the many benefits that Jesus has to offer, then you and I, too, must deepen our faith lives. Our faith lives can deepen, like the thankful man healed of leprosy did, when we, too, offer thanks. Our faith lives can deepen when we get to know Jesus more deeply through listening attentively to God in Scripture and prayer. Our faith lives also can deepen through being faithful to what God asks of us through our charity, love, and mercy for others. Pope Francis says this isn't just what Jesus calls us to do for others, but this is what other people need from us. This is what everyone needs from us.

After having entered into that deep relationship with Jesus, through, as Paul says, a perseverance in faith, we can hear Jesus say to us, "Your faith has saved you."
