

Reflections on the Solemnity of Christ the King - November 20th, 2022 Fr. Gary Luiten

Today as we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the King, our thoughts are drawn to Jesus who is our king. Jesus, we know, is a good ruler. He is just and merciful and full of forgiveness. He was a king who never held public office and never had a throne (unless you want to call the cross his throne). Jesus never held any official position in society and yet there is no other single person who has influenced the world more than Jesus Christ, our King.

Arguably, one of the greatest qualities of a king, or a leader, is that they bring out the best in people. In examining scripture, we must say that Jesus did bring out the best in people. He brought health to the sick, hope to the despairing, and faith to the doubter. Jesus softened people's hearts. Remember after Jesus death the centurion's heart softened and he said, "Truly, this was the Son of God."

Like Christ, we must ask ourselves, "Do we bring out the best in others?" Do we help make it possible for Christ to shine out in people's lives? Hopefully the answer is yes. If so, then we are doing very well at being leaders, whether we hold a position of authority or not.

Jesus also loved the people of his Kingdom. This is another quality of a good king. May our love for others be with that same love. May we have the courage and the strength to use our leadership qualities and authority not selfishly, but for the building up of the kingdom of God, and to seek to use God's love in bringing out the best in others.
