**Reflections on the Readings for the 32<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time - November 6<sup>th</sup>, 2022**  
**Fr. Gary Luiten**

The readings today are about people with a lot of faith. The first reading from the Second book of Maccabees is one of the books of the Old Testament and was also considered by the Israelites at the time of Christ to be one of the books of the Bible. And these books are about the Maccabee brothers and their mother. They took their Jewish faith seriously. They had a firm conviction about their faith, and they were martyred for it.

Now we probably will not become martyrs in this country. But we can follow the example of the Maccabee brothers and their mother in the sense that they realized that there is something greater that awaits us. They believed in an eternal life. And as we approach the end of another church year (only two Sundays left after this Sunday), the readings are and will be on the end of our lives and on heaven which awaits us.

And heaven is really what the gospel is about today. It's a humbling thing to think of that we will not live forever in this life. It puts things into perspective. Unfortunately, the Sadducees in the gospel today did not believe in heaven. The Sadducees were in direct contrast to Jesus, who is focused on rising again.

May our promise of salvation and eternal life be the motivating factor for us not just to live out our faith an hour a week, but to even be willing to give of our lives, if it comes down to that, like the Maccabees did in their lives, realizing that there is a heaven that awaits us.

**Since this is the first bulletin of the month, I have a few other items for you.**

Parish Fall Dinner and Bazaar. Thank you to everyone who gave of their time, talents, and treasures to help make our Fall dinner and bazaar a success this year. A lot of people worked really hard. I know a number of people slept well Sunday night! It was a success not just financially, but in helping to build community. Congratulations to those who won the raffle drawings.

Communion from the Chalice. Finally, after a two-and half-year break, Bishop Folda has announced that parishes may once again offer communion under both forms. Some of our neighboring dioceses have been doing this since last year. This month we will begin offering communion from the chalice. Like before, this does not mean you must receive from the chalice, but you may receive. It makes for a better symbol. However, the church teaches that all of Jesus is contained under the form of bread and that all of Jesus is also contained under the form of wine.

Thanksgiving Dinner. Blessed Sacrament will once again hold a Thanksgiving Dinner, which will be served in the social hall Thanksgiving Day from 11 am to 2 pm, following Mass at 10 am. We will need many volunteers once again. By the grace of God and your help, we have always been able to serve all who come. Please watch the bulletin for upcoming details.

May God bless us and keep us safe and healthy now and through the upcoming months.

# Vote NO on Measure 2 Recreational Marijuana

Catholics have an obligation to help protect human life, the family, and the common good. If passed, Measure 2 will legalize recreational marijuana in our communities. The experience of others states that have legalized marijuana shows that legalization does more harm than good, especially when it comes to the health, safety, and well-being of our families and children.

- Marijuana is addictive and there is mounting evidence for the existence of a withdrawal syndrome. Studies have shown that some 10% of users will become addicted.
- Legalization has led to a dramatic increase in marijuana use in states that legalized recreational use.
- Marijuana has been shown to have adverse effects on mental health, and intelligence - including irreversible declines in cognition, and the respiratory system.
- Driving while acutely intoxicated with marijuana greatly increases the risk of a fatal motor vehicle collision. States with legal use of recreational marijuana have seen substantial increases in marijuana-related DUIs.
- Normalization also increases the likelihood of adolescent use where the consequences of use are more pronounced.
- The lack of reliable testing methods is a direct threat to workplace safety.
- California's experience shows that rather than reducing illegal activity, legalization of marijuana has led to more illegal growing, more marijuana-related crime, more violence, worker exploitation, and environmental devastation.

These are just some of the reasons the Catholic bishops of North Dakota have joined law enforcement and business groups to oppose Measure 2. Please vote No on Measure 2.
