The Advent Wreath and Candles

The wreath is meant to remind us of both the immortality of our souls and God's promise of everlasting life to us through Christ.

The candles: Four candles represent the four weeks of Advent; one candle is lit each Sunday, signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. A Fifth candle represents purity.

Week Four: On the fourth week of Advent, we light the final purple candle to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait for the birth of our Savior. This final candle, the "Angel's Candle," symbolizes peace. It reminds us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."

Reflections on the Readings for the 4th Sunday of Advent - December 18th, 2022 Fr. Gary Luiten

The readings today remind us in one word that "God is with us," and that is Emmanuel. In the first reading from Isaiah, The Lord tells king Ahaz that the virgin shall be with child and shall call him Emmanuel. Here Isaiah is telling us in effect that Jesus is God. He is "God with us, the wonder-counselor, the God-Hero, the Father-Forever, the Prince of Peace." God is always here for us as an outlet, as the one in whom we can find shelter, under whose wings we can hide for comfort.

A person who really understood the meaning of "God is with us" was Joseph. He is quite active in the gospel today and yet not a word of Joseph is recorded in scripture. They say "Actions speak louder than words," and this is certainly the case with Joseph. He prepared a place for Jesus in his spiritual life and in his physical life.

Although God is with us, we can still prepare a greater place in our hearts for God to dwell more completely. Each one of us is called to remove anything that may get in the way of Jesus to be born in our hearts in a special way this Christmas. May we use these last few days of Advent to prepare our lives to welcome the savior in a more complete and total way. May Joseph and Mary be our models as they welcomed Jesus into their family.
