Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time January 22, 2023

The readings today speak about unity, not just in conversation but in our ideals and in our faith in particular in the midst of a pagan society. Scripture tells us that unity ultimately comes when everyone lives the values Jesus calls us to live. You could say "We're not there yet!"

Sadly, there is division today. Sometimes even we ourselves may have tendencies to push more for division rather than unity. It is against all this division that Jesus has come. Jesus has come to unite and to break down the walls that divide people. That is one reason Jesus began the church. "Church" means "gathering," or "assembly." It is meant to help bind us together.

And, incidentally, we are hearing more and more of people who say, "I'm faithful, I'm Christian, but I don't believe in organized religion." This includes some very public figures. The problem is when you look at the scriptures and what Jesus was doing, it is difficult to support that idea when, in fact, Jesus was doing exactly that when he called the disciples in the gospel. He was organizing his religion, calling, and binding the people together, beginning with the twelve apostles. We celebrate every Sunday to help bind us together as a church

community. We gather together so Jesus may bring us all together one day in heaven.

And the Lord calls forth a response from us to that invitation to unity, and the calling is loud and clear today: repent! When we receive the Eucharist, we are receiving not just Jesus, but the Father and the Holy Spirit, too. And they are perfectly united. Let our prayer be that we be united with one another and all the members of the Body of Christ as Jesus, the Father, and the Holy Spirit are one. That was Jesus' prayer. And hopefully that will be our prayer, too. May Jesus bind us together as one as He did to the apostles and give us the courage we need to do what they did, to go out and spread the good news by our words and actions!

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

When I announced last summer that the Diocese of Fargo would hold a diocesan synod, I explained our need to prayerfully reflect on the state of our diocese and how we can carry forward the mission that Jesus has entrusted to his Church, a mission to live the Gospel and to "make disciples of all nations" (Mt. 28:19) Thank you to those of you who have responded already to the parish self-reflection survey that we made available over the last two months.

Now we have arrived at another stage of preparation for our diocesan synod. Regional listening sessions will begin in mid-January and take place at sixteen locations throughout the diocese. We will begin each session with a time of prayer before our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, followed by time to reflect and discuss as a faith community on a few key questions: What are the things that are working well at your parish/diocese? What are the challenges to address in your parish/diocese? What is one step I might be called to take to respond? We won't be putting the tenets of our faith up for a vote, but we will consider how we are living the faith, and how we can live it more fully in our diocese. I intend to be present at each of these listening sessions, and I hope you will make an effort to attend and participate in these gatherings to give input for our synod. A map and list in the *New Earth* provides the locations and dates of each session.

Based on this consultation process, and with the help of the Holy Spirit, we will continue our preparation for the synodal assembly in April 2024. This 3-day gathering will include representation from throughout the diocese and will prayerfully discuss the mission and the needs that lie before us. Our diocesan synod, the first in seventy years, will be an occasion for all of us to listen to the voice of our Lord as we strive to follow him more closely and carry forward the work he has given his Church to do in the Diocese of Fargo. The listening sessions that will now begin are meant to be a communal exercise of our whole diocesan family with Christ at its center, so I look forward to seeing many of you in attendance. Be assured of my prayers, and God bless you.




