LENT

Lent

A 40-day period leading up to Easter that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Thursday. It is a season of prayer, fasting, and works of charity (almsgiving). Lent reminds us of Jesus preparing for his preaching, teaching, and healing ministry, all leading up to his passion, death, and resurrection during that first Holy Week. Lent reminds us of the love that Jesus has for the Father and for us, how Jesus unselfishly came to serve and give his life as a ransom for all of us. Love is what Lent is all about.

Ash Wednesday is February 22. Mass times are 9:00 a.m. & 7:00 p.m.

Stations of the Cross Blessed Sacrament will host Stations of the Cross each Friday of Lent at 7:00 p.m. in the church. All are welcome to join us.

Lenten Regulations

- Everyone 14 years of age or older is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.
- Everyone 18 or older, and under 59 years of age, is bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, only one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted.

When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

Now make your way to the Table and follow the steps to the encouraged during your Lenten journey.

Pack the Pew is Coming! Our Parish Lenten Project is "Pack the Pew". We will collect non-perishable food items in a pew of the church. As the weeks pass the pew will become full of groceries for our hungry neighbors. We keep 1/3 of the food for our Blessing Box and 2/3 will go to the Emergency Food Pantry.

The CHOSEN Season 1 will be shown on most Friday's during Lent at 7:30 p.m., following Stations of the Cross. Mark your calendars, bring your friends and family members, a comfortable chair, and encounter Jesus Christ through the experiences of those who were called by Him, cured by Him, and challenged by Him. This is not your typical movie about Jesus. Don't miss out on "Your encounter" with Him.

Lenten Colors

<u>Purple</u> is predominant during Lent and has many meanings. It's the color of the robe Pontius Pilate put on Jesus before His crucifixion. Purple is also the traditional color of royalty, and represents that Jesus is our king.

Rose (not pink) is worn on the 4th Sunday of Lent to symbolize the half-way point and to give us joy in our Lenten journey.

Red is worn on Palm Sunday and Good Friday, to foreshadow Jesus' death on the cross.

White is used on Holy Thursday and Easter

Sunday because it is the color of joy.

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



7th Sunday in Ordinary Time February 19, 2023

We are called to love others, even those who do not love us. And this message is clear to us in the first reading from Leviticus and in the gospel of Matthew. The call to Love is really a calling to holiness, as we heard in Leviticus. Perfect holiness really is the perfection of love. That is what we are called to do by our maker. It is good for us to realize that we can't become perfect in holiness and love on our own. We need the help of God. This is given to us in the sacraments. A great way to grow in holiness is doing what is offered every Saturday afternoon at 4:00 p.m. I drop the things I am doing, and I go to the confessional. This sacrament ties in well with Paul's letter that we heard from today, which says that we are "temples of the Holy Spirit." That means it is important to keep our lives in good spiritual order because the Holv Spirit lives in you and me. The greatest being that ever was or will be actually lives in us! We are its home.

So, if someone asks you, 'Is perfection in holiness really attainable?" The answer is "without God, no. With God, yes!" May God help us to grow in holiness by loving one another. Sometimes little children say things so profound. A little girl, age 6, by the name of Nikka, once said, "If you want to learn to love better, you should start with a friend who you hate." Those are the Lord's words also, to love our enemies. May God help us to be shining lights of the Holy Spirit and instruments of Christ as we carry out His will in the world by loving our enemies, and thereby become perfect in holiness.
