

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Sunday, Feb. 5, 2023

In the readings this weekend, we see the importance of "the Light." That is what Jesus called his disciples, and that's what he calls us. He doesn't call us worthless; He doesn't call us animals or evil beings; he calls us light and salt! Let's take a look at these two images.

Jesus in the gospel calls us the light of the world. In other words, if we do not let our light shine, then the world has no light. The world would then be in spiritual darkness! Because we are the light of the world and have Jesus in our lives, we have the ability to build one another up instead of cutting one another down. We receive Jesus in the Sacraments and in the Word of God spoken from scripture.

Jesus also says we are the salt of the earth. Can you imagine what some food would be like without a little salt? But it doesn't normally taste as good. Salt gives it that added flavor. It takes away the dullness that food can have at times. And when we hide our light under a bushel basket, we, as the salt of the earth, become dull and flat. And when salt goes flat, it is good for nothing. You can't even throw it on the ground for fertilizer! It is only good for burying deep in the ground, or maybe on ice in the winter to melt it.

Notice, in the scriptures you will never find people who were bored with Jesus. No one thought he was dull. Some people didn't agree with what he said, but he was anything but dull. He spoke with authority and people listened. He cured people, he healed people, and, most importantly, he took away their sins. And he still takes away sins today in the sacrament of Reconciliation.

Being the salt of the earth may not involve just acting and speaking, it may also involve listening to others and simply being there for them and listening. So, as we live our lives in Blessed Sacrament, may the Lord help us to be the salt of

the earth and the light of the world, guiding others to the truth, safety, and security in Christ Jesus.

This is the first bulletin of the month; I have a few other items for you.

No Masses. There will be no weekday Masses next week – February 8 through the 10. I will be taking a mid-winter break.

Lent. Lent begins this month. Ash Wednesday is February 22. We will have Masses at 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. Just a reminder that it is a day of fasting for those age 19 through 59, and also a day of abstaining of meat (as all Fridays of Lent are) for those age 14 and over. We will have stations of the cross on Friday evenings in Lent at 7 p.m. in the church, followed by a wonderful video series in the social hall called "The Chosen."

<u>Bingo!</u> Thank you to all who supported our youth this past month for youth bingo. We still have bingo most Sundays at noon in February and March, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus. You are all invited to attend.

Read the Gospels.


