





Fasting, along with prayer and helping the poor, is one of the three spiritual disciplines of Lent. These work as a three-fold conversion practice as we prepare for the joys of the Easter season. Fasting adds a serious edge to your prayer life. It is a prayer practice that involves denying yourself something in order to increase your spiritual awareness, strengthen a commitment, or petition God for something you or another person really needs.

Fasting is also about detachment - separating yourself from something that you have become overly attached to. It's a way of reclaiming your spiritual strength and regaining some balance in your life. Practicing some denial of our wants and needs in small ways can help us grow in self-discipline and the ability to put off momentary comfort for a larger, more important goal.

Fasting should not be misused to gain praise or sympathy, to manipulate, or to harmfully affect the body. Done correctly, it can be a spiritual practice that can take your prayer to a new and different level!

## Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Lent March 12, 2023

The readings this weekend are about the importance of water. In the reading from Exodus, Moses finds the people grumbling again because they were thirsty. So Moses did something about it. He struck the rock with his staff, and water flowed for all the people to drink.

In the gospel today, Jesus tells the woman at the well he will give her living water, which is the spiritual water one needs for the everlasting life of the soul. The gospel shows us that Jesus is the one, and the only one, who can quench our spiritual thirst.

The Church Fathers tell us that Jesus is also indirectly referring to the Sacrament of baptism, when water was poured over us and we became children of God and members of God's family. On Easter Sunday and the Easter Vigil, we will have the opportunity to renew our own baptismal vows. Sometimes it's hard to live out our Catholic faith for a whole lifetime. But if we take our life and split it up into manageable chunks, it is quite possible to live. So that is why we renew our baptismal vows every year.

The Church also tells us that in the narrative of the woman at the well, Jesus is hinting at the well of the Eucharist. He wants us to come to the Eucharist! How often do we come to Mass? Do we come every Sunday or every Saturday evening, like we are called to? Hopefully we do. And if we do, do we really realize what we are receiving? It is not just a symbol, but really is Jesus! It is the same person we serve in one another. It is the same person we offend in one another. The Eucharist is the same person we help in one another.

In addition to the importance of the Eucharist and Baptism, the gospel also is telling us something else very important. For centuries, Jews and Samaritans were bitter enemies, because the Samaritans were half-breeds. They were Jews who intermarried with non-Jews, which was against the Jewish law. They were not even on speaking terms. Jesus changed all that in today's gospel by speaking to the Samaritan woman. Have we not all a lesson to learn from our Lord's mercy and kindness, which broke through racial and national barriers on that day in Samaria?

And so, let us continue to pray that we may never take our faith for granted. May we joyfully accept the Sacraments God has to offer especially Baptism and the Eucharist, and may we live those out in our lives by treating others as our brothers and sisters in Christ.
