What is Palm Sunday?

Palm Sunday is celebrated the week before Easter. Catholics carry blessed palm branches into church with them - this is in remembrance of when Jesus entered Jerusalem. The story of Jesus' death and his Passion are read as the Gospel.

How to Observe Palm Sunday

Sunday Mass on Palm Sunday includes two readings from the Gospels. We hear about when Jesus entered Jerusalem at the start of Mass. And we read the Passion account during the Liturgy of the Word. A great way to start your Holy Week is by reflecting on Jesus' passion.

After attending Mass it's common to display your palm. Some place it behind a crucifix, some take several palm branches and weave them together to create a palm cross. Since palm branches are a sacramental item (because they are blessed), they should not be thrown away. You can return your branch to the church where it will be burned for ashes the following Ash Wednesday.

Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



The 4th Sunday of Lent - March 19, 2023

In this weekend's gospel Jesus cures a blind man. And curing is one thing that God can do for us too! God cures us from our spiritual sicknesses. In contemporary society we have the danger to think, "There's nothing spiritually wrong with me. I don't kill people. I don't rob banks. I don't steal cars. I don't commit adultery." And that's when we need to turn to the scriptures where it says in Romans 3:23, "All have sinned. And that's where the Sacrament of reconciliation comes in.

And why does God choose to use the priest for the forgiveness of sins? The Lord is the ultimate one to ask about this. But I presume it is because we humans have the need to hear the words. "I absolve you" after committing an offense against God and others. God could have said, "Turn to me in the privacy of your own home and ask for forgiveness from any sins you have, and they will be forgiven," but he didn't. He gave us the sacrament of reconciliation as an instrument of God's forgiveness like the paste he used to cure the blind man. For those of you who missed the reconciliation service on Thursday or who haven't gone to reconciliation for a while, there are still opportunities. We still have 4:00 p.m. reconciliation available on Saturday afternoons. There are also other reconciliation services scheduled throughout the area. Check the bulletin for times.

And so, on this 4th Sunday of Lent, also called Laetare Sunday, which means "Rejoice Sunday," there is cause to rejoice. There is someone who cares enough to heal us spiritually and even physically at times. We know someone supports us. God desires to bring us peace and joy. So, even though we are fasting and meditating on the passion and death of Jesus, we do it joyfully, realizing that we have found the answer to our


