

#### FORMED - What to Watch.

This week, I am excited to tell you about the Formed series on the *Stations of the Resurrection*: Via Lucis, the Stations of Light. The Stations of Light is a devotional practice for reflecting upon the joy and hope of the Resurrection during the Easter season. While the traditional Stations of the Cross commemorate Jesus' journey to his crucifixion and death, the Stations of Light focus on the events that follow the Resurrection from the Empty tomb to the Road to Emmaus, to the faith of Thomas, to the Ascension and to Pentecost whereupon the followers of Jesus like Mary Magdalene and the Apostles have personal encounters with the Risen Jesus. The commentary on the Stations of the Resurrection provided by Dr. Tim Gray and Dr. Ben

Akers, provide powerful insight into the each of the stations as well as how each of the stations shows Jesus' intent with each of these encounters and how this applies to our Easter faith and to the Mass today. I really enjoyed this series and once again learned so much so don't miss this one.

Also, on Formed this week, for the children, is a video called *He Is Risen* which is very good and can be viewed not only during this Easter Season but anytime during the year.

Another suggestion this week is to view the video called *Divine Mercy* with Fr. Michael Gaitley, which will prepare us for Divine Mercy Sunday on Sunday April 16.

#### Reflections by Fr. Gary Luiten



#### Divine Mercy Sunday April 16, 2023

The readings today all have in common the topic of belief, to believe and have faith in Jesus. In the gospel today we hear of the Thomas' lack of faith. Jesus' death was hard on Thomas and the other disciples because Jesus had been preaching on living forever. Thomas had put his faith and time in Jesus. He really invested in Jesus. Then Jesus died. And Thomas was trying to get over the Lord's death. He figured Jesus' resurrection was too good to be true.

One person we can probably relate to at times is Thomas. Thomas was one who was known as the doubter. He doubted everything until it was proven to him. Sometimes we, too, can have a lack of trust in God. No one wants to look like a fool. And that's what happens when we place our belief in something that turns out to be false. But we know that our God is true! Jesus said, "I am the Way, the truth, and the life." We can be thankful that our faith is something solid we can hold on to!

Thomas doubted until he saw the wounds of Christ. Then he believed. In today's gospel, Jesus is speaking about us. He calls us to believe, when He says, "Blessed are those who have not seen, but believe!" God gives us the gift of faith to help us make it through the difficult times.

This second Sunday of Easter is also called "Divine Mercy Sunday." Having recalled Jesus' passion, death, and resurrection the past week or so we now look back and see as a whole the great act of loving mercy that Jesus did for us when he gave his very life for us on the cross. The title for this day goes back to the year 2000, which is just a very brief time in the whole history of the church. Divine Mercy Sunday is a title that has been given to this day by none other than Pope John Paul II when he canonized St. Faustina who had a devotion to the Divine Mercy. Pope John Paul was canonized on this day, too.

So may the Lord help us to understand and to believe that He will take care of us and our families, that everything will work out in the end if we place our trust in Him and in His church.




