





Easter Season

Easter is the greatest celebration in the Catholic church because it is the completion of the Holy week that ends with the resurrection of Jesus. Easter celebrates the beginning and foundation of Christianity. Jesus was raised from the dead, and it goes to show that He conquered sin and death.

The Easter season is the second-longest liturgical season. Only Ordinary Time is longer. The Church celebrates the Easter season for 50 days, culminating with the feast of Pentecost, the day we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church.

This season gives us time to rejoice and experience what we mean when we say Christ is risen and that we, as the church, are the body of the Risen Lord. It's a season for focusing on the core doctrines and mysteries of the faith and for preparing for the ministries the Spirit has empowered us to undertake in Jesus' name.

Reflections on Easter Sunday - April 9, 2023

We made it through another Lenten season. Now we remember and celebrate our Lord's resurrection as evidenced in the gospel this weekend by the empty tomb. Soon we will begin to see water outside, not the frozen kind but the liquid kind. And it's interesting that on this Easter Sunday weekend, water is a very important part of the celebration. We have the sprinkling rite which recalls the water in which we were baptized. This water represents the cleansing of our spirits and new life. And we can't get too much of that. We can't drown in God's love and life. And that's what the celebration of Easter is all about: about God who, like water, gives us life.

The Saturday night Easter Vigil begins in darkness which represents a lack of life. I know that nobody likes darkness, especially when they have to work. They want light in order to see. The darkness which is spoken about in the creation account in Genesis, as well as the darkness that prevailed when the church throughout the world began Mass on the Easter Vigil represents the chaos, the disorder, and the sin which our world has come under since the fall of our first parents.

The darkness has passed, and now the season of light begins! We celebrate with glorious songs, such as the Gloria and the Alleluias. We haven't heard those two songs at all in the last forty days. The light came on Saturday night in Easter Vigils throughout the world in the form of the Paschal candle which represents Christ himself. It is the candle like the one which was lit when we were born again at baptism. And it is the candle which will be lit when we are born again into eternal life.

Living in the light of Christ is not always easy. It sometimes takes work, and it takes faith. And for all of us, renewing our own vows that we or our parents made at our baptism is a good thing. It helps us to refocus and reminds us of the meaning that we can find in life. We pray that, as we renew our baptismal vows this weekend, God would give us an ever-fresh zeal for defending and proclaiming our faith in our risen Lord now, throughout the Easter season, and for the rest of our lives.

On behalf of the staff and myself, I wish you all a very Joyful and Happy Easter. May our crucified and risen Lord be your source of strength now and forever.
